

# IKBC NEWSLETTERS in LOCKDOWN

September 1<sup>st</sup> 2020

So, here we are 5 months down the road and playing a weekly online game and a weekly Relaxed Pairs game but we are still a long way from sitting down together in the Ropes Hall.

The online community continues to thrive with 143 players registered for the Thursday evening game where we regularly attract around 20 tables. In addition, Chris Green and Jacks are running a Relaxed Pairs game on a Monday evening with 30 players registered for that event.

In addition to all of that, a new 2-year "Learn to Play Bridge" course is starting in September. Details will be available on the website shortly so if you know of those for whom the current situation is becoming a little tedious, let them know that they can learn a new hobby to keep them entertained. The course will be delivered online.

We are getting to the time of year when we need to plan to hold our AGM and this year the committee have decided to follow the example of the Suffolk Contract Bridge Association and run the event online. We will be in touch with all of you over the next two months sending you details of how we will manage this event and how you can take part.

It is also the time of year when your membership secretary starts constructing the blue receipt book, with which you are all familiar, to collect the membership fees for the new club year that starts on October 1<sup>st</sup>. Not this year, however.

The committee have decided that under the circumstances no membership fees will be charged for 2020-21. The membership list that existed on the 1<sup>st</sup> October 2019 will be deemed to be the membership records for the coming year subject to members' approval at this year's AGM. Furthermore, no brochures will be distributed this year.

Negotiations are currently underway with the Kesgrave Community Centre to ensure that our regular bookings for Thursdays and Mondays (for classes and Relaxed Bridge) are not in jeopardy so that once we all feel that it is safe to do so, we can return to the much-missed face to face game.

The committee continually monitors the current climate regarding playing face to face bridge and we have heard of some clubs (usually those with their own premises) that have begun to open their doors again. However, in our case, as we meet in public premises, there is no way we can meet the restrictions being imposed on the venues and on the players by those pioneering re-openers.

We are now running some of our normal competitions online and we've made them available to all our online community. The plan is to continue to do that into the new club year although the details are still under development. As always – watch the website for news.

For those of you whom we don't 'see' regularly at the moment, do keep in touch and tell us how you are. We are always pleased to hear your news. And of course, if you'd like to play again and need help to participate in the online events please don't hesitate to contact us. A lot of help is available.

This week we heard that Robert Green (one of the long-time members of the club) had been in hospitals in Ipswich and London over the past two months because he suffered a heart attack and endured a by-pass procedure. The news is that he is home and recovering well according to our source. On your behalf, we have sent him a get well card and all of our good wishes.

Once more, we trust you are all coping as well as you can with the current circumstances, and we urge you to stay safe and well as we head towards autumn.

So what have we been up to?

### **COMMITTEE MEETINGS**

We are holding these fortnightly Zoom meetings on Saturday mornings to make sure we keep track of all the events in the bridge world that affect our club. Clearly, at the moment, the issues concern our Virtual Club and the pros and cons of running that event weekly.

We continue to monitor the wider bridge community to make sure we stay abreast of national and international developments and to gain ideas of how we can continue to make bridge available to those who wish to play now and in the future.

### **ONLINE CLUB UPDATE**

As previously reported we are having considerable success with the Thursday pairs on BBO (23 tables last week). We have 67 club members registered to play and 37 from clubs around the county. We welcome them all.

We are running the Men's, Ladies' and Mixed Pairs competitions online this summer as well as the other three online competitions which are already taking place.

The host system is in place and so far running well. Host pairs are awarded BBO\$6 each for hosting (equivalent to our voucher system).

Chris Chambers has updated the results facility on the website. To see what is available check out the new 'replay' links on the travellers.

We have a post-play Zoom meeting in what has come to be called the Post Mortem Arms that opens at 9:30 on Thursday evenings where members can drop in for a chat. **It doesn't matter if you haven't played in the event, you are always welcome to drop in.**

From that source, I gather that some of our members are being helped to play on BBO by others already taking part. We look forward to welcoming you to the online table. ### **FORTNIGHTLY FRIDAY SEMINARS - from 11:00 to 12:00**

These are proving popular. We're pleased to report that those joining the seminars are not necessarily all playing online bridge but are joining the seminars anyway. Participants report that the discussions keep the bridge brain alive! The website has details of the topics and how to take part and how to login. Our thanks go to Chris G and Chris C for all the work they do in hosting them.

### **NEW INITIATIVES – MENTORING AND RELAXED PAIRS**

#### **MENTORING**

From 1st July we are offering a new mentoring service to anyone who would like it. The new on-line world creates great opportunities for mentoring. The process will be that your mentor would "watch" a session of bridge that you have asked your mentor to watch and he/she will then provide feedback either via email and/or via a zoom call. If this sounds like a service you

wish to take advantage of please register via the IKBC website and a mentor will be in touch with you.

### **Mentors**

Anyone who would willing to be a mentor please contact Chris Green directly. You don't have to play to mentor, just be willing to kibitz an online event and give some feedback afterwards either on general approach, specific hands or specific topics.

### **RELAXED PAIRS**

Soon now, bridge classes come to an end and players need to be able to move on to playing. In July, we will be setting up a "Relaxed Pairs" event on BBO, separate from our 'Thursday Pairs' where we offer an opportunity for players to play a few hands online (12-16 initially) with help available from those running these events.

These sessions are open to all those whose bridge skills are still developing. Anyone can join in, but we ask that all players play simple systems only. Where necessary Robots will be used to complete a table and we will allow players to "UNDO" a bid or play made by mistake. We're being "relaxed" about this!! You don't have to be a member of any club to play but you do need to register online with IKBC. Details will be available on the website within the next couple of weeks.

### **FINALLY, INFORMATION FROM SUFFOLK**

Again, if you don't know about Zoom, contact Anne or any other committee member who will explain the very simple process of joining in a Zoom session using your computer. The committee are using this facility to hold our meetings – yes, they are on-going – and of course ZOOM is the way you enter Jack's "Post Mortem Arms" after play on Thursdays.

### **HOST PAIRS**

For those of you who are playing on Thursday evenings, we are about to initiate a "host pair" system to avoid the difficulties that occur when we have to use random BBO substitutes who can simply just drop out when they feel they've had enough. This situation causes the directors and the players significant angst. The committee have agreed that any host pair who volunteers their services will be offered BBO\$6 each (equivalent to our host voucher system of two free sessions). If you'd like to volunteer, email Alison our host secretary ([contact details](#) on the club website).

Note that if you wanted a game and your services as hosts are not needed, the EBU run a competition on BBO starting at 7:30 on Thursdays in which you can play.

## IKBC BECOMES AN ONLINE CLUB

As we intimated last week, we have been exploring our options to make sure that our Bridge Club can go on offering playing opportunities to our members so that we can all continue to enjoy our hobby in these challenging times.

Thanks to successful negotiations between the EBU and BBO (Bridge Base Online) we are now able to run our own Virtual Ipswich & Kesgrave Bridge Club online at the regular club time of **7:00** starting on **THURSDAY 23<sup>RD</sup> APRIL**. This is because we now have a license to run paid tournaments where table money is charged, Masterpoints are awarded (*but not NGS ratings*) and we have the right to book the time slot that works best for our members. For the moment we will stick to the current practise of playing 20 boards in a session. We may review that in time.

To play, you will be charged BB\$3 table money (equivalent of £2.40) where BB\$1 = US\$1 (*currently 0.80p*) If you think we are now supporting the American economy, rest assured: 70% of the table money you pay is returned to our club because of the new collaboration between the EBU and BBO.

Buying BB\$ is easy and just the same as buying any goods online. If you are at all uncertain, Peter Bushby has produced an excellent online video showing you exactly what you have to do. Here is the link

If you are using a Mac / Ipad, start by logging in to BBO using Safari (*this is very important*) then click on the 3  horizontal bars to find the BB\$ icon.
