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Our sympathy goes out to the family of **Bob Trowbridge**, one of the original Founders of JSOB. As celebrated on the recent occasion of JSOB's 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary, Bob initiated the process to determine the feasibility of a free-standing bridge center in Jacksonville. A host of others helped bring his idea to fruition. Bob passed away suddenly this past weekend. No public services will be held.

The Longest Day is an annual fundraising event to support the Alzheimer's Association. In nine years of participation, ACBL has raised almost \$9 million! The event takes place on the longest day of the year, the Summer Solstice, and symbolizes the challenging journey of those living with Alzheimer's and their caregivers. Our club has contributed every year except during the pandemic. In 2022 we contributed the most so far, over \$3000. Our volunteer co-chairs, Lorie Holmes and Michael Smalline, contributed last year both in terms of hard work and financial support and will co-chair again this year. During the week of June 19, there will be a silent auction for a game with one of the top ten players in the club (minimum starting bid \$50). At the table near the directors' desk, choose your player and record your bid. The winners will be announced at the game on June 23. All game proceeds from JSOB's Longest Day event will be donated to the Alzheimer's Association by JSOB, and sanction fees will be donated by the ACBL. Please help us top our 2022 donation by playing, participating in the auction, and/or making a donation. There will be a box for donations on the front desk and our co-chairs will be accepting donations all day June 23. Bridge is uniquely suited for The Longest Day because studies have shown that playing strategic games like bridge help keep your brain healthy. The Alzheimer's Association has even included playing bridge on its list of 10 Ways to Love Your Brain. --Lorie Holmes

## North American Pairs (NAP) Qualifying games: June 1-August 31

Play in these games, and if you qualify (many players do), consider advancing to the unit and district levels! Typically very few pairs choose to compete, so at any level (A [Open], B [-2500], C [-500 Non-Life Master] your chances of advancing are excellent! And you can get colored points: at club qualifying games, 50/50 red/black; at 1-session unit qualifying games, red; at 2-session unit qualifying games, percentage of gold for overalls. District finals award gold for section firsts and overalls. NAP starts at the club level in June (2, 5, 8, and 30 at JSOB), July (3, 4, 13, and 25), and August (TBA). Club-level qualifications may be earned at any club in any unit in any district. A player may qualify as often as desired and with as many different partners as desired. Optional unit-level qualifiers are held after Sept 1 and before the district final, held after the unit final until the third week in January. At the district final, both players must have qualified at the club level (not necessarily with each other) and must be members of the parent district. District winners receive cash prizes (\$300-\$700 per person) to help pay for travel to the final at the Spring 2023 NABC.
