Mentor-Mentee Program

Signups for the 2026 Mentoring Program will begin Nov. 10 and run through Dec. 10. A signup sheet will be posted on the Mentor/Mentee bulletin board during that time period. This free program provides an opportunity for newer and developing players to increase their skills in all facets of the game by working and playing with more experienced players in an open section environment. The program runs on a calendar year, beginning on Jan. 1, and mentees play with their mentors at JSOB once a month. We culminate and celebrate the year with our annual Mentee/Mentor game in late fall. Mentees can participate in the program for up to 3 years provided they meet the progressive requirements outlined in the guidelines. We have 20 Mentees in the program this year, running the gamut from 1st year mentees with few masterpoints to 3rd year mentees with several hundred. They are also posted on the Mentor/Mentee bulletin board at the club.
