# An Interesting Hand

# Don Kersey's Hand Analysis of Board 7 from Wed Nov 1 (F2F game)

This was Board 7 from the November 1 face-to-face game: South Dealer, both sides vulnerable 5D all went down, it is perhaps

- **♠** A Q J 8 4
- **Y** K 8
- ♦ A J
- **♣** J 7 6 2
- **♦**9653 **♦** K 10 2
- **♥** Q 7 ♥ J 10 6 5 4 3 2
- ♦ Q 8 **1096**
- ♣ Q 10 8 4 **\$** 5
  - **♦** 7
  - **♥** A 9
  - ♦ K 7 5 4 3 2
  - ♣ A K 9 3

The auction should start 1D - Pass -1S, and East should pass (3H is inadvisable when vulnerable). South will probably rebid 2C, and the auction could then proceed in several ways.

North-South can make 12 tricks in

either minor suit, but since the three declarers who reached 5C or fortunate that nobody bid a minor suit slam.

3NT can make 11 tricks, but on a heart lead (likely if North declares), South will win to finesse the diamond jack, losing to the queen, and another heart will take out North's stopper. After running the diamonds and cashing the top clubs, declarer could make 11 tricks by leading toward the club jack, but this only works because West has no more hearts, so it would be a bold declarer indeed who tried that play, and 10 tricks would be a satisfactory result (and in fact proved to be a tie for top).

How about the minor suit slams? 6D has to lose a trump trick, but with careful use of the entries to the North hand, declarer can set up the spades to provide discards for

South's two club losers. 6C, on the other hand, is a tight-rope walk. Say West leads a spade, to North's ace. Declarer cashes the ace-king of South leads a diamond, West can clubs, learning about the evil split. Now South must play diamond ace, diamond king, diamond ruff, even though that seems to leave West with two trump tricks. Declarer continues by cashing the heart king (optional, but it clarifies the further play) and leading the spade queen, covered by the king and ruffed, weakening the trump holding still further. The position now looks like this:

**♦** J 8 4

**9** 8

**♣** ]

**♦**96 **1**0

**♥** Q ♥ J 10 6 5

♦ 7 5 4

**4** 9

The three winning diamonds serve as trump substitutes, neutralising West's menacing holding. When see that ruffing with the queen won't work (West would have to return a black card, allowing North to draw West's last trump, or a heart, allowing South to win the ace and continue diamonds to pick up West's remaining trump). Ruffing the diamond with the ten doesn't work either (North would overruff and cross to South's heart ace, and further diamond leads would limit West to one trump trick). So West discards on the diamond, and North discards a spade. On the next diamond lead, the same considerations apply, so West again discards and North discards another spade. Now on the last diamond, if West discards yet again, North will discard the heart 8, and South will lead the heart ace; whether West ruffs high or low, North's trump jack will be declarer's twelfth trick!

What a great analysis... Thank you Don! I think I pre-empted (wrongly) as East. (Ed.)

# Promoting and Practicing ZERO TOLERANCE at KDBC

KDBC is a ZERO TOLERANCE Club. This means that players' behaviour must be ethical and considerate at all times. The purpose is to ensure a pleasant atmosphere at the Club (and on BBO).

Our Club by-laws state, in part, that: "Any complaint about the conduct of a member during a game should be addressed to the Director." (By-Law 3-1)

"While most complaints should primarily be addressed to the Director, members may make a formal complaint about another person's behaviour or ethics. This complaint shall be in writing and be addressed to the Recorder." (By-Law 3-5)

ACBL has a ZERO TOLERANCE POLICY to which KDBC subscribes. It states in part:

"Below are some examples of commendable behaviour, which, while not required, will significantly contribute to the improved atmosphere:

- Being a good "host" or "guest" at a table.
- Greeting others in a friendly manner
- Praising the bidding and/or play of the opponents (<u>not</u> your partner!)
- Having two clearly completed convention cards readily available for the opponents (this is actually a regulation, not just a nicety.)

The following are examples of behaviour that will not be tolerated:

 Badgering, rudeness, insinuations, intimidation, profanity, threats or violence. Continued...»



- Negative comments concerning opponents' or partner's play or bidding.
- Constant and gratuitous lessons and analyses at the table.
- Loud and disruptive arguing with a Director's ruling.

If a player at the table behaves in an unacceptable manner, the Director should be called immediately."

#### ♥ BBO Etiquette TIPS ♠

Please greet your opponents, and let them know if you have any special systems, right at the start.

Remember to alert your own bids (even as "mundane" as 1NT = 15-17 hcp or transfers).

Use the **private chat function** to chat with your partner after the boards are completed. Don't use the table chat. Just select "private" on the chat screen and type in your partner's BBO name.
