Opening the bidding with full strength opening hands Somethings to remember

1. Look at the good and bad features of the hand and upgrade or downgrade your hand accordingly

When you have a hand with full opening values (not a 2C strong opening) remember that HCP are not everything.

Positive hand features: Add 1 point

- At least 2 ½ 'quick tricks'
- Intermediate cards lots of 9s and 10s
- Suits with multiple honours AKJ, KOJx, AOTx, OJT
- A long 7 card suit headed by AKQ
- A two suited hand 6 card suit and
 a 4 card suit

Negative hand features: Subtract 1 point

- Singleton KQ or J
- Doubleton KQ, KJ, QJ, Qx, Jx
- No aces
- Q and J making up half your HCP
- No long suits.

2. Bid your suits in the right order

- When you have two long suits of equal length bid the higher suit first.
- When you have two four card suits bid the lower suit first.
- When you don't have a five card major suit bid your longest minor first.
- When you have two three card minors bid 1C.

KQT54 5 7 AQ9652 Open 1C not 1S. Open your longest suit first, even with 5 spades.

Some things to avoid

3. Avoid awkward rebid problems - think about your rebid

J2 T3 AKQT K7432

Prefer 1D to 1C, even though the club suit is longer. If partner bids a major you are stuck for a rebid if you open 1C. 1NT is unappealing with a short suit, 2D would be a reverse, and you don't want to rebid a weak 5 card club suit. Plus your diamonds are quite nice even though you only have 4. A hand like this is the exception to the bid your longest suit first rule!

4. Avoid opening with a pre-empt when holding a long strong major and opening values

5. Avoid opening at the 1-level with a hand with 16-21HCP and 9/10 playing tricks – open 2C

6. Avoid opening 2C with a balanced 19-20HCP hand

7. When with a balanced or semi balanced 15-17HCP hand prefer to open 1NT than one of a suit

Prefer to open NT with a semi-balanced hand (even with a 6-card suit!) and values for a NT opening, even if you have two strong doubletons. Whether you do it with a 5 card major is a matter for partnership agreement. If you are going to open NT with a 5 card major you may need a way to find a 5-3 major suit fit, like extended stayman or puppet stayman.
