It was gone 7.30, so Chair Irene said we'd have an informal chat rather than the formal AGM and asked me to start on the League and F2F/Online.

About 30 seconds into my talk, someone said they'd spotted Gary Hyett approaching!! So I stopped and Gary came up to the room to widespread applause if not a standing ovation!!!

The AGM was quorate!! 20 people had turned up, and the AGM went ahead.

But Raymond had to leave prematurely, so we were down to 19 people and inquorate again, so subsequent votes were only "indicative" and the

first Meeting of the Executive has to make the decisions."

NORTHERN BRIDGE LEAGUE


