### **Debacle of the Month**

In Hand 14 of the January 23 BBO 1500 game West went down 8 in a 3-NT doubled contract – luckily, not vulnerable – for minus 2000. East opened 3 clubs with a 7 card club suit headed by 3 honours. So far so good. After South passed, West bid 3 NT – probably asking for a feature because West had club support and a very unbalanced hand. North doubled and East, with no feature, passed rather than return to 4 clubs. Now not so good. N/S had solid spades and hearts and were on lead to run both suits. Eventually, E/W did take one trick. On the lay of the cards. 4 clubs by E/W makes.

#### Member Profile – Aftab Alibhai



Looking for new directions in his life around 2017, Aftab Alibhai developed two new interests. He became an adult swim instructor following up on a life-time interest in swimming. More importantly to us, he acted on a suggestion that he consider playing bridge. Aftab had always enjoyed playing cards but had never played bridge. He also notes that even the most experienced players seem to have the occasional disaster which reinforces to Aftab that bridge is a game of perpetual learning.

## **Hunting for Masterpoints!**

Below are two charts showing the masterpoint requirements from Junior Master (5 points) to Life Master (500 points) and the sources of the various colours of points required. Above Life Master there are 9 additional levels from Bronze Life Master to Grand Life Master. We will leave those higher levels for another time.

To move up the Master rankings, a player requires increasing numbers of masterpoints. But it is not enough to just have the total masterpoints required; a player must also have the required minimums of masterpoints of various colours. The colours are black, silver, red, gold and platinum. The colour of a masterpoint depends on the game/tournament where it was earned. See the Sources of Coloured Points chart above.

**Note on unpigmented or online points:** In addition to the coloured or pigmented points referenced in the chart above, there are also unpigmented points earned in online play on BBO (or other online bridge platforms but only BBO will be referred to). While Virtual Club games on BBO (and other Virtual Club games) award black masterpoints, games that are not run by Virtual Clubs award "unpigmented" points. These games include the various types of solitaire games and the BBO-ACBL pairs games.
