Following refreshments, the Chairperson welcomed everyone to the meeting.

1. Minutes of the 2019 Annual General Meeting

On a proposal by Heather Hill, seconded by Toni Sproule, the Minutes were accepted.

2. Matters Arising

3. **Annual Reports**

The Secretary said that an unlikely spinoff from the current pandemic was that the Union was gaining new clubs and members. This was due to the reliance on playing bridge online and the desire of clubs to avail of expertise in running online events – which could only come from affiliating to the NIBU.

The Treasurer thanked David Leeman for continuing to carry out his annual inventory of NIBU assets.

The Masterpoints Secretary expanded on his report giving details on plans to run as many Union fixtures as possible online during the new season.

On a proposal by Liz Scott, seconded by Sandie Millership, all the Officers reports were accepted.

4. Financial Accounts

The Treasurer said the Financial Statements showed a deficit of £1,473 for the year.

On a proposal by Ian Lindsay, seconded by Anne Hassan, the Accounts were accepted.

5. (Outgoing) Chairperson's Address

The Chairperson paid tribute to all those working to keep bridge alive through online tournaments, Diane Greenwood and Roberta Madill. He thanked Anne Hassan and Pat Johnston for their tireless efforts in encouraging young people to participate in bridge. He also thanked the Officers for their work and made special mention of the dedication towards supporting clubs shown by Ian Hamilton during the current pandemic.

Harold Curran then handed over to Heather Hill and offered his support to her over the next 2 years.

Heather Hill took the Chair.

6. Chairperson's Address

The Incoming Chairperson thanked her predecessor and paid tribute to the work he had done over the past 2 years. She went on to remind those present of the sheer amount of hard work that is done behind the scenes, not just by the Officers but by several other individuals who have always shown a willingness to 'do their bit'.

She expressed pleasure at seeing so many Intermediate players participating in online competitions and confirmed that the Union would gladly help and support clubs whose members wished to participate in online bridge. In closing, she said that members could raise any issue with her directly and she looked forward to her term of office.

7. **President's Address**

The President welcomed the incoming Chairperson into office and went on to support her request that members should bring any issues they have directly to the Officers rather than indulge in backroom gossip and rumourmongering. He also paid tribute to the work being done behind the scenes and singled out Kevin Hinds and Sandie Millership for special mention in relation to their work with online events.

8. Election of Officers

Geoff Booth asked that changes to the weekly programme of online events be highlighted on the website as soon as possible.

Liz Scott said congratulations were due to Wayne Somerville who had finished 2nd in the Mutton Cup, an expert individual tournament held in Madrid recently.

There being no other business, the Chairperson closed the meeting and asked that Council members wait behind for a short briefing.

At the meeting of Council members, the Chairperson explained that Officers had been meeting in 'Emergency' mode via Zoom and it was anticipated that this would be the medium for Council meetings in the near future.

John Ferguson said that the Emergency Committee appeared to be working well and suggested that things continue as they were pro tem. This was agreed by all present.

The meeting closed at 3.10pm.

CHAIRMAN'S ANNUAL REPORT

Good afternoon. It gives me great pleasure to welcome you all to the Annual General Meeting of the NIBU

It is certainly the case that, during these extraordinary and unprecedented times the NIBU has been supported throughout by a great bunch of people. I would like to thank my fellow members of the Emergency Management Committee who have endeavoured to help keep matters of the Union continue unabated. I would also like to thank members of Council, who while have had little to do this past year, were always there if called upon for comment.

Of course we have all missed the balance of face-to-face meetings, the ability to meet together to discuss and debate issues. In this new world, where on many occasions there is often no clear right and wrong, reaching sound consensus driven decisions, has been a particular challenge and we in the NIBU have not perhaps always got it right first time.

The challenges of dependence on the online game have been and to an extent remain, substantial. It is universally recognised that, unfortunately, there remains a sharp rise in the number of players who are cheating. the NIBU, like all NBOs within the World Bridge Federation, condemns such behaviour.

At this point let us pause to remember all our fellow players who have died during this past year. in particular Margie Kelso, a long time supporter of the NIBU and widow of the late Billy Kelso former treasurer, secretary and Congress organiser. Also Gerry Fitzgerald a former Chairman of the NIBU and President of the Irish Bridge Union - a perfect gentleman in every way.

With apologies to some I may have inadvertently omitted as I was unaware of their passing.

Unfortunately the hard work started by Norma Irwin and her team with Primary School bridge has been put on hold due to the pandemic, so I have nothing to report there.

I would like to thank Sandie Millership and Norman Lacey for their continued hard work with the Junior Camrose and Peggy Bayer teams. they are also running coaching sessions with players who have not yet made these teams but are our future. Both these teams had some success in the competitions held on line in February.

While neither our Camrose nor Lady Milne teams were successful this year we continue to hope!. The trials for these are held each year for those who have sufficient national (red) points or are considered to have potential. There are many of you out there who should think about entering - you never know how you will do until you try!. Playing in NIBU competitions is where you gain these points and improve your standard - so come out and play.

I would like to thank Ian Hamilton for organising a number of these competitions online this year and also our TDs - Ian himself, Alan Hill and Sandie Millership. My thanks also to Diane Greenwood for running our weekly online competitions. This is a huge commitment and are very grateful to her for doing it.

My thanks to Harold Curran for running two sessions of the lockdown league- a great success and much enjoyed by many from all over Ireland. He is planning to start another session starting in September so watch out for details on the NIBU website and get your entries in.

Thanks to Brian McDowell and Helen Hall for keeping our website up to date and to Brian for organising the Northern Ireland Teams on Real Bridge.

We had a very successful Autumn Congress online which was organised by Ian Hamilton and run for us by the EBU. We are planning to run this again this year so put the dates in the diary - 10th -12th September.

Online bridge has continued at club level with 19 clubs running weekly tournaments producing a total income of £35 686.78 to the end of March . I am sure you all appreciate the amount of work our Hon. Treasurer, Anne Fitzpatrick puts into distributing these funds. We are also grateful to the CBAI for enabling our clubs to benefit in this way.

All that remains now is one of the most important duties of the Chairman - to elect a successor. It is with great pleasure that I welcome Brian Mullan as Vice Chairman. Brian is well known in bridge circles in the Mid-West and will bring a new perspective to the role.

HONORARY SECRETARY'S REPORT 2020-21

This has been a year like no other with no live bridge taking place and yet more players competing online than ever before. At the time of writing, it seems uncertain whether bridge clubs will be opening their doors again in the near future and even if they do whether players will return in the same numbers as previously. Will the need for social contact with other players trump the comfort of playing from home — only time will tell. It is likely that the two mediums will learn to co-exist with 'casual' competitions being played online and more prestigious events such as Congresses being held live. In the meantime, online cheating remains a major problem. One way to counter the problem is to bring players together playing online in one place but socially distanced. For International events, the world of real playing cards and BBO Operators suddenly seems like outdated technology. It will be interesting to see what the next season brings.

Affiliation.

Despite the absence of live bridge around the province, 33 clubs remain fully affiliated to the Union with a few others deferring their membership. This is a much better outcome than might have been expected a year ago. It reflects not only the loyalty of our clubs but also their recognition that the Officers continue to work tirelessly behind the scenes to keep Bridge events going. For well over a year now, clubs have been facilitated with online competitions every week as well as access to the majority of regular annual NIBU events. All affiliation fees for 2020-21 will cover clubs for a two-year period so in the majority of cases, fees will not be due again until November 2022. Meanwhile it is worth reminding everyone that the affiliation fee has been £5 per member for many years and continues to offer remarkable value for money.

Council

Due to the pandemic, it was not possible to hold any live meetings during the year. However, Council did meet via Zoom in February, and it is hoped that members will be able to meet more frequently during the incoming season. For obvious reasons it has been agreed by the Management Committee that the current Council membership will continue to serve for a second year.

(Emergency)Management Committee

Over the past year the Committee met on 8 occasions, 1 of which was 'live' and 7 via Zoom. The Committee has been undertaking the work of the Selection and Tournament Committees as well as managing all Union business. However, it remains the case that any major policy decisions will have to be ratified by the full Council. We all look forward to our first opportunity to meet round the table.

Other NIBU Committees

Due to the pandemic these bodies have not been active over the past season.

Website

The website is updated regularly with news and results by Helen Hall and Brian McDowell. The Hon. Secretary acts as Moderator for the website and is the recipient for the (many!) queries that are submitted via the 'Contact Us' facility.

HONORARY TREASURER'S ANNUAL REPORT 2020-21

We now have survived a full accounting year of lockdown as a consequence of Covid–19. Online bridge has become the platform for all bridge with no definite date planned for return to face to face competitions. Indeed another Autumn Congress will be held virtually this September. Many thanks to Ian Hamilton for organising the Inter Club and for his efforts in running online competitions and also to Diane, Sandie and all the Clubs who play bridge on BBO.

Our largest source of income is now from BBO (£6,386 for the year) with CBAI administering funds and monthly remittance being received which in turn is distributed to the various clubs after an administration charge.

Competitions held virtually were the Congress Teams (Net Income £937) and the NI Teams (Net Income £300). Our thanks again to Ian Hamilton for running the Interclub with net income of £1,930. Our normal expense for representative matches turned into Income of £1,102 as flight costs were refunded and the Lady Milne was held on Real Bridge. We are due to host the Teltscher in 2022 and it is hoped this can be held as a face to face competition.

A net surplus of £6,646 was incurred for the year with our reserves increasing from £51,817 to £60,463.

Affiliation fee to the IBU remained at £2,500 and to BGB £500.

During the year clubs encountered difficulties collecting fees from their members and it was decided that any amounts received would cover a two year period. Total fees received from clubs was £8,485 and £4,192 has been deferred until the year ended 31st March 2022. Unfortunately bridge in schools was not possible during 2020/21but hopefully this will start again in the new season.

HONORARY MASTERPOINT SECRETARY'S REPORT 2020-21

To say this year was one of upheaval in the bridge world would be an understatement. None of the NIBU affiliated clubs has played any face-to-face bridge during the season. However, thanks to the Union management, we have been able to keep the flag flying online. A number of clubs or groups of clubs have now an online presence, have played and submitted Masterpoints.

In addition, the NIBU was able to run most of its normal events on-line this year. The only missing events were the Leagues and the NI Mixed Pairs. Many thanks are due to directors Alan Hill, Sandie Millership, Jim McGilly and others for kindly getting results posted and delivered to me so that the Masterpoints can be updated in timely fashion.

The same sentiments apply in equal measure to all the club secretaries and scorers who helped in getting club Masterpoints uploaded onto the system during the year.

The following clubs or groups returned Masterpoints :-

Causeway Coast North Down Clubs Portadown Area Derryvolgie Lisburn City Windsor Kelvin/Malone Newcastle Group Spa Diane Greenwood Boat Club Merville Warrenpoint

Some clubs did not affiliate for the season, and their database was simply emptied of members in the hope that they would re-affiliate in the future. Also, many members with multiple club membership only paid their affiliation to one. This meant that the membership numbers held up surprisingly well, even if affiliation fees dropped markedly. Current registered NIBU club members are 1530, down from 1708 last season. This drop is largely explained by a significant number of players not playing online and therefore eschewing re-joining their club for the season.
