1. Minutes of the 2018 Annual General Meeting.

3. Annual Reports

The Chairperson paid tribute to Greer Mackenzie and the work he had done over many years in setting up the NIBU website but who was now stepping down. Members showed their appreciation in the customary fashion. The Chair spoke about his first year in office, stating that the hosting of the Junior Internationals had been a highlight. He paid tribute to all the organisers and spoke of the warm congratulations he had received on their behalf from many of the participants.

The Secretary said that, due to an oversight, the election of the office of President had been overlooked when determining business to be transacted. However, the matter would be dealt with along with the election of Officers and Councillors.

The Treasurer informed members that the Union had incurred a loss for the first time. Congress sponsorship had been lost and income from competitions was down.

The Competitions Secretary regretted the continuing downturn in entry levels to Union events, a situation reflected in comments by the Chair of the Selection Committee.

The Chairs of both the Laws & Ethics Committee and Youth Committee were not present and were thanked for their reports.

On a proposal by Nuala Mooney, seconded by Toni Sproule, all reports and related documents were accepted.

4. Financial Accounts

Once again the year started in September with our Congress. Many thanks are due to Anne Hassan and her team for their hard work in making this such a successful and entertaining weekend.

The autumn continued with the usual competitions and various trials. In early January, the Camrose team travelled to Edinburgh to compete in the first weekend of the competition. The SBU were excellent hosts and although our teams did not take any of the main placings it was a very enjoyable weekend. The second weekend was held in La Mon on the first weekend of March. Our International Match Manager, Helen Hall with her team not only organised the weekend but operated the BBO vugraph. Liz Scott and her excellent team of BBO vugraph operators ensured this ran smoothly. I felt so proud of the NIBU as plaudit after plaudit was received from team captains and competitors alike for the organisation and hospitality of the weekend with everyone saying it was the best Camrose weekend ever!

It is particularly pleasing that our schools bridge programme continues to go from strength to strength. Under the guidance of Norman Lacey and Norma Irwin and their team of enthusiastic and dedicated volunteers, 500 primary school children learnt the basic skills of bridge. This is a real achievement for the NIBU and something we should be very proud of. I hope we will have a Peggy Bayer team representing the NIBU in the near future.

From December, Covid 19 was developing internationally, eventually making its way to Ireland in early Spring. Given the age profile of our sport we are an at risk group which led to the cessation of all events when lockdown became the order of the day. Events such as Leagues and Cups remain to be completed at this stage and will be finalised when normality returns.

My thanks go to the tournament committee and in particular to Ian Hamilton for running the Simultaneous Pairs events. Ian already has everything organised for the next season. He does sterling work in maintaining the Master Point records and his technical expertise has come to the fore since lockdown in running online events. I would encourage all NIBU members to support our first virtual Congress in September. It is very pleasing to see our wider membership enjoying their online bridge experience. Hopefully this will lead to greater participation in our future events.

My tenure as Chairman has now come to an end. I would like to thank all those who supported me during the past year especially the Office bearers. My thanks also for the continued reliable input of our Tournament Directors, particularly Alan Hill, Sandie Millership, Diane Greenwood and Kevin Hinds.

I am delighted to welcome Heather Hill as Chair and wish her every success in these unprecedented times and look forward to supporting Heather throughout her tenure.

HONORARY SECRETARY'S REPORT 2019-20

Affiliation

There are currently 42 clubs affiliated to the Union, an increase of 1 (Banbridge) from the previous year. Fees are payable for the season commencing 1st September each year and are collected during the period November – February. New members may join clubs throughout the year after which they will be assigned an NIBU membership number – the fee remains at £5 per member.

Council

Council met on 5 occasions throughout the year June 2019 - February 2020. At the last meeting, 4 members of Council resigned in protest over the reversal of a decision by the Selection Committee. A fifth member resigned shortly afterwards.

Management Committee

This committee meets immediately prior to the start of each Council meeting in order to agree proposals which will be put to the members. During the current pandemic, the Committee met in 'Emergency' mode via 'Zoom' on several occasions in order to ensure that Bridge could continue to be played online.

Other Committees

The Selection Committee met on 6 occasions prior to March 2020 and the Laws & Ethics Committee on 1 occasion.

Online Bridge

This has replaced 'live' bridge in the province during the current emergency. The NIBU presently hosts duplicate events on 4 days each week while many affiliated clubs are also running their own competitions. The Autumn Congress will be held online, and it is hoped to run the annual fixture list of events for the 2020-21 season also online. As things stand it looks unlikely that live club bridge will return in the near future. However, it remains the hope that the outstanding Home International fixtures i.e. Lady Milne & Teltscher Trophies will be played, possibly 'live', in early November. Although it is hoped that the 2021 Home Internationals can proceed as normal, the NIBU has no plans to hold trials in the near future. The situation is under constant review.

Website Queries

The new website, with its many new features, has been a major success. Members may now submit queries online, all of which are automatically forwarded to the Hon. Secretary.

It has not been possible to produce a diary for the incoming season.

Thank you Ian for everything you do for the NIBU, you are, in my opinion undervalued.

We hosted the Camrose match this year, organised by Helen Hall (International Match Manager) assisted by Anne Hassan, another successful event TD'd by Fearghal O'Boyle and Mairead Basquille. The Union received many plaudits at the end of the competition. The NIBU are the smallest Union, however we are the best organisers.

Brian McDowell, ably assisted by Tom McKeever, organised the NI Teams event in Portstewart and entries were up on last year, again my thanks Brian.

Anne Hassan is our Congress Organiser and has worked tirelessly for the NIBU.

Sandie Millership TD'd the Provincial Mixed Pairs for me in Enniskillen, and numerous other events. For some events she stood in at the last minute. Ken Hammond TD'd the North Down Inter A&B competition, Eric McNicholl TD'd the Novice section of the Gala Pairs. HONORARY TREASURER'S ANNUAL REPORT

Our gross income has decreased by £2,840 in the year due to decrease in Bequests and transfer from Junior reserve and cessation of competitions when lockdown was imposed as a consequence of Covid – 19. We are in unprecedented times with no face to face competitions now being substituted with online events. Indeed our Autumn Congress will be held virtually. Many thanks to Ian Hamilton for organising the Inter Club and for his efforts in running online competitions.

Competition expenses have decreased as entries are down. Our biggest expense is representative matches although Junior expenses were down with no Peggy Bayer team representing Northern Ireland. The Camrose was hosted by NIBU this year with consequent increase in costs. Our expenditure for home international matches remains very competitive due to the continued efforts of Helen Hall, Anne Hassan and Harold Curran with the support of La Mon Hotel.

A net deficit of (£1,473) was incurred for the year with our reserves decreasing from £53,139 to £51,817

We increased our Affiliation fee to the IBU to £2,500. The IBU have increased costs due to the success of Irish teams in International bridge with the Seniors qualifying to play in the World Championships in China in September.

During the year £151 was spent out of reserves on Junior Bridge. Expenditure on promotion of bridge in schools amounted to £1,049. Credit to Norman Lacey, Norma Irwin and team of volunteers who were responsible for nearly 500 primary school children learning bridge prior to lockdown and hopefully this will start again in the new season.

I would like to thank all those Tournament Directors and Club Treasurers who have assisted me throughout the year.

The same sentiments apply in equal measure to all the club secretaries and scorers who helped in getting club Masterpoints uploaded onto the system during the year.
