Note 1 Broad Griffiths XX =Weak with 5cd suit, partner bids 2C then pass or correct; bid of a suit is 4cds + 4 cds in higher raking suit

Note 2 Over a major shows the other major and a minor; 2NT asks:
 Over a minor shows both majors; In both cases weak or strong

Note 3 Over 2C weak 2D =T/O; Over 2D x=T/O; Over 2M 3C=T/O; In fourth seat x=T/O; Similar over 3 level pre-empts

Note 4 Even is McKenney Odd is encouraging in that suit

Note 5 A direct double shows either 12-15 or 20+ hcp, in pass out seat shows 16-19 hcp
 2NT shows 15-17 responses as after a 1NT opener. Other bids natural.
