## Bridge – it's a big deal.

The EBU's festival of bridge – a week of events from the 9th to the 15th of September to raise awareness of this great game. They have partnered with Cancer Research and aim to raise £60,000.

As part of the festival we intend to run a **county wide simultaneous pairs** on Monday 9<sup>th</sup> September. We hope that all our affiliated clubs will join in. The same boards will be played at a session on that day and the results from each club will be uploaded to ECATS who will then produce a ranking of pairs across the county. Star player, Rob Miller, has agreed to write a commentary on the boards so you can compare what happened at your table with Rob's expert view. There will be a surcharge applied to your usual table fee to cover the ECATS fee and to contribute to Cancer Research.

## David Ogg writes:

I am a fairly new member of our (brilliant) Stamford Bridge Club having completed Sue Moss's excellent beginners' course in early 2022. Since then I have played at the Club in a number of different sessions on different days and wondered what it might be like to compete against others, elsewhere. An email from Marcus (Witt) asking for teams to compete in the County League encouraged me to ask 4 SBC friends to come together and

form a team to give it a go. We didn't really have a clue about what we might be letting ourselves in for - foolhardy, some might say!

Our application was accepted and we are designated 'Stamford F' in Division 2 of the Northamptonshire League. We are by far the lowest ranked Stamford team (by NGS - ours at the moment being 4, 10, 7, 7, 8). Our first couple of matches were against other Stamford Teams (C & D) and we were predictably hammered - but very nicely, and in excellent company! These matches were face to face and were very enjoyable. Each match included some small successes giving us encouragement - we even 'won' the second half of one, with a single card played making all the difference. We then faced the challenge of a match on BBO (I am a member of the post-Covid bridge cadre, so getting sorted on BBO was challenging.) Anyway, all went well - we were beating Towcester BC at halfway, but collapsed in the final 12 boards to lose out overall. We tried our best, and the margin of defeat was reducing with every game played.

Most recently we played Bourne B - again on BBO. It started well for us, and we were winning after 12 (of 24) boards. After some pretty poor bridge by me in the second half, things got much closer, but we still ended up winning - I think - the score is yet to be confirmed with our opposition. Once again the event was played in very good spirit and was most enjoyable. One of our team even played this in match while on holiday overseas - total dedication!

We now have two matches to play before the end of the League season (dates are in the diary....) and with a win under our belt we go again with renewed optimism. It really is great fun and I can thoroughly recommend the experience. Everyone we have played against has been very kind to us as 'team bridge newbies' and there are so many experienced players to ask about procedures and the like. Please do think about entering this very friendly league next season - it's a great experience. Thanks to my teammates Gaynor, Stuart, Stephen and Steve. Two matches to go - with a fair wind we could finish with 3 wins from 6 - but I suspect that Stamford E and Northampton C will have something to say about that......
