

## I thought we had doubled?

There are 2 types of situations

1. Immediately after the board has been played and the players don't agree
2. Sometime later either at the end of the session or after the scores have been posted

1. In the case the two sides do not agree on the score to be entered, you call the Director. Unless it is a simple case of counting how many tricks were made, it will go down to the Director making a judgement based on the most probable contract. The Director can look at the score cards of the players which may give a clue as to what the actual contract was.

For example, Imagine that NS were in the contract going one off, and EW claim they doubled but NS don't agree. If both EW have filled in their score cards with the double, it is more likely to be the case.

This can happen without any bad intentions as NS may have not noticed the double as they were concerned with whether it was a good bid or not, or else ways distracted.

Imagine there are no clues like the score cards then the Director will have to make a decision based on probability.

Imagine NS say they were in 3H making and EW say they were in 4H-1 The Director will weigh up the odds of each contract being bid and give an adjusted score on that basis.

2. After the end of the session or even the next day when the scores are posted on the website, a player may realise that a mistake has been made.  
Contact the scorer and point out the discrepancy and then if the opposition on that hand agree, then the score can be corrected.  
Really both sides should check at the time the scores are entered but occasionally it happens that no one notices the mistake until later.  
The worst that can happen is that the score stays the same!

NB Sometimes when an adjusted score is entered, the scoring program can effectively generate an error eg if one side is put in as an average minus (40%) the scoring program will automatically generate an average plus (60%) for the other pair, but this may not be correct.
