## As Declarer in a Trump Contract

- One of your first thoughts should be how to handle the trump suit.
- In general you should extract the opponent's trump as soon as you can.
- However, if you don't have the ace of trump, you should think carefully before you give the opponents the lead.

But the difference between the finesse and the drop is only about 3 percentage points.

Now, suppose you were to know that west had started with 6 spades and east had only 2.

East wins the spade ace and continues spades, which you win with your queen. You play a diamond toward dummy. West plays the queen.

## Safety Plays

- A safety play can sometimes insure a contract when a suit splits in an adverse way.
- However, a safety play often gives up a trick that would not be lost if the suit split in a normal manner.
- In matchpoint scoring, that can produce a sub-par result.

You have $6 \vee$ made with no problem, unless one defender has all 3 (K, J, 9) missing trump. To guard against that possibility, lead a low heart from north toward dummy, covering any thing east plays, except of course the king. If either opponent has all three hearts, you will lose only one.
