Responding When RHO Makes a Takeout Double

30 Minute Mini lesson

Thoughts and Understandings

- When partner opens the bidding and RHO doubles:
 - You have accounted for approximately 26 of the 40 points in the deck.
 - If you have 9 or 10 points, LHO probably has no more than 4 or 5 points.
- Basic understandings
 - Redouble shows 10+ points.
 - New suit bids are not forcing.
 - You don't have to bid simply because you have a few points.

Exceptions

- When you have an unbalanced hand with most of your points in one or two suits, it is often better to bid a suit than to redouble.
- Consider this hand:

- **★** A K 8 6 3
- **y** 5 3
- ♦ KJ 106
- **♣** 5 4

`RHO You dble ??

- With a hand like this one, many experts would bid
 1 ★ rather than redouble.
- Then make a constructive bid later to show the strength.
- This means, of course, that 1-level bids must be forcing for one round.

2-Level Bids are Natural, Non-Forcing and Less Than 10 points

With What Sort of Hand Do You Redouble?

- As responder, you redouble when you know you are prepared for whatever the opponents might do.
- When you redouble you expect to do one of the following things.
 - You expect to bid some level of no trump.
 - You intend to double the opponents.
 - You expect to raise your partner's suit.

- RHO dble
- You Redble

- ♣ K 10 9 7 4
- LHO bids 1♥ or 1♠, you bid 1 nt, showing 10-12
- LHO bids 2♣, you will double for penalty.

RHO You dble Redble

- **★** K 2
- K J 8
- ◆ A 8 6 3
- **♣**10 9 7 4

No matter what opponents do, you will raise hearts.

- **★** K 4 2
- **YQJ86**
- K J 8
- ♣ K 10 9

LHO bids any thing at the two level double for penalty.

- You Redble

No matter what the opponents bid, you've got them.

After a redouble, jump raise partner's spades.

What Does a Direct One-nt Show?

- Because of RHO's double no obligation to keep the bidding open.
- Nevertheless, with a good 6 to 9 points, you should bid.

RHO You dble ??

- ♥ Q 7 2
- Q863
- ♣ Q 10 7

A really bad 7 points. <u>Best to pass</u>.

- **♦** 7 5
- **Y** K 8 2
- Q J 9 7 2
- ◆ 9 8 4

A good 7 point hand. Worth a raise to 2 ♥.

A good 8 points. Bid 1 nt. Another good 7 point hand. Bid 1 nt.

A Jump Raise of Opener's Suit

- Regardless of what suit partner has opened, a jump raise is weak.
 - Good trump support.
 - At least 4 cards for a major suit
 - At least 5 cards for a minor suit.
 - Good distribution.
- The opponents might have a game, so you want to get in their way as much as possible.

They may have game in hearts.

Bid 3 ♠.

They almost surely have game in hearts. Bid 4.

RHO You dble ??

★ K 7 2

♦ J 108

◆ Q J 7 4 2

♣ J 4 2

♣ A 10 9 4

They may have game. <u>Bid 3</u>♦.

Even with this weak hand, bid 3♦.

Jump-Shifts are Also Weak

- A Jump-shift over RHO's take out double should show:
 - A reasonably good suit.
 - A weak hand.
 - Too weak to redouble.
 - Too weak to make a regular, non-jump bid.
- Be aware that RHO has shown some values in your suit.

The Jordan Convention

- Partner opens a major suit, RHO doubles, you have 10-12 points.
- Your hand can be:
 - a. 2-card or fewer support for partner's suit.
 - b. 3-card support for partner's suit.
 - c. 4-card or better support for partner's suit.
- With a: redouble, then make the appropriate bid or double.
- With b: redouble, then raise partner's suit.
- With c: bid 2 nt.
