#### Some Guidelines for Third-Seat Opening Bids

#### Marty Says

- What you should be thinking about.
- ☐ First decision-whether or not to bid.
- ☐ Second decision-what to bid.

# In Deciding Whether or Not to Bid, Marty Says...

- Be aggressive in third seat.
- With a weak hand and a long suit it is an ideal time for a preempt.
- Vulnerability is a factor, but don't let it cause you to "quake with fear".
- Make an effort not to pass.

#### With Balanced Distribution

- Open with 9+ points when not vulnerable.
- Open with 11+ points when vulnerable.
- Partner knows you might be weak, so she will bid accordingly.
- When you have a regular opening hand you must show it to partner, but know partner has less than 12 points.

# When You Have a Weak Hand and a Long Suit

- Know that LHO has a pretty good hand.
- Your job within reason is to make life as difficult as possible as you can for him.

#### Bergen's Rule of 24

- In third seat, after two passes...
- Estimate 8 points each for the two passed hands.
- That leaves 24 points, between you and the 4<sup>th</sup> seat.
- Subtract your points from 24 and you have a good estimate of what your LHO has.

- Using Marty's rule of 24, you estimate LHO has 18 points.
- You know LHO will bid something and their side will take the contract.
- You can help partner make the best opening lead.
- Bid 2 **♦**.

- **♠** 4
- ▼ K Q J 9 7 5 3
- ♦ J 10 6 5
- **4** 3

- Using Marty's rule of 24, you estimate LHO has 17 points.
- Opponents likely have a cold 4 ♠.
- Normally, opening 4
   with a 7-card suit is bad
   bridge, but not here.
- Bid 4 ♥.

- **♦** J 10 8 6 5 4 2
- **Y** 10 7 3
- **♦** 65
- **♣** 3

- Using Marty's rule of 24, you estimate LHO has 23 points.
- You expect LHO is about to open 2 ♣.
- They very likely have a slam.
- Bid 3 ♠.

- **♦** J 10 8 6 5 4 2
- **♥** Q J 3
- ♦ KJ
- ♣ Q

- You have 10 points. LHO should have about 14
- This is probably a partscore hand.
- Any 3 level bid is likely to go down.
- Bid 2 ♠.

- **♦** 5 4 2
- **Y** 3
- ♦ K 7 4
- ♣ K 10 9 8 5 3

- You have 6 points. LHO should have about 18
- They have a spade or heart fit.
- Almost certainly have game.
- If your suit was a major, you would open 2.
- Partner has about 8 points.
- Bid 3 ♣.

- **Y** K 9 8
- ♦ Q 9 6 5
- ♣ Q 6

- **◆** 5 4 2
- **¥** 3
- ♦ K 7 4
- ♣ K 10 9 8 5 3

Okay, those were some weird hands. Now let's look at some more or less normal hands.

We're still using Marty's rule of 24.

Remember the thought process we have been discussing:

- ☐ First decision-whether or not to bid
- Second decision-what to bid

- **♦** J 10
- **∀** K J 3
- ♦ K 10 7 2
- **♣** J 8 5 2

- You have 9 points. LHO should have about 15.
- Marty says open 9 points when not vulnerable.
- Here you have 9 relatively bad points and no suit you want partner to lead.
- No good reason to open this hand, probably best to Pass.

- **♠** Q J 2
- **∀** K Q 4
- 9742
- ♣ Q J 6

- You have 11 points. LHO should have about 14.
- You have enough points to open.
- You don't have a suit you want partner to lead.
- Yuck 4-3-3-3 distribution.
- This is probably a partscore hand.
- Too many quacks.
- Best to Pass!

- **♦** A 10 9
- **9** 8 7 3
- ◆ AJ 10 7
- **♣** 5 2

- You have 9 points. LHO should have about 15.
- A much better 9 points.
- 2 Quick tricks
- Nice middle cards.
- Offers partner a good opening lead.
- Open 1 ♦.

- **A** A K 10 9
- **7** 3
- 9732
- ♣ K 10 9

- You have 10 points. LHO should have about 14.
- Enough for 3<sup>rd</sup> seat opening bid.
- You really don't want partner to lead diamonds.
- You want a spade lead.
- With this hand 3<sup>rd</sup> seat, open 1 ♠.

- **\$** 8
- **9** 7 6 4 3
- ♦ A K J 10 8
- **♣** J 2

- You have 9 points. LHO should have about 15.
- 5-5 come alive.
- Normally you would open your higher-ranking suit.
   Not here!
- Likely your LHO will declare in spades or no trump...
- You don't want a heart lead.
- You can open 1 ♦.
- But you should give a lot of thought to 2 !

#### Final Thoughts

- We're dealing with judgment, in this lesson.
- It won't always work out perfectly for you.
- Follow the guidelines we have discussed.
- Use common sense.
- And most of time you'll come out ahead.
