

# The Negative Double




## The Negative Double

- A conventional double, used by the responder after:
  - Opener bids 1 of a suit.
  - The next bidder makes an overcall.
- The negative double promises:
  - At least six points
  - At least 4 cards in the unbid major suit(s) and tolerance for other unbid suits.
  - May also have a 5- card suit with a hand too weak to bid at the two-level.


Negative double showing at least 6 points and at least 4 hearts.



Negative double showing 4-4 in the major suits. Might be 4-3, with a weak hand.




Negative double showing at least 6 points and 4-4 in the major suits. Might have 5-4 with a weak hand.



Responder Double

Negative double showing at least 6 points and at least 4 spades.



### Rebid by Opening Bidder

- You open the bidding, LHO bids and partner makes a negative double. You can:
  - With 4 cards in the suit indicated by partner, bid the appropriate level of that suit.
  - Rebid a 6-card suit.
  - Bid no trump with a stopper in the opponent's suit.
  - Cue bid opponent's suit, with a strong hand and no stopper.
  - Bid partner's suit with 3-cards (last choice)

## Bidding After a Negative Double

Consider the bidding of the negative doubler, after opener has rebid.

Negative doubler's rebid. Example 1

You have game-going points.

Opener shows a fit with your suit.

Partner RHO You RHO
1 ♣ 1 ♠ double pass
2 ♥ pass pass pass

★ 3 2♥ K J 9 8◆ Q 8 3◆ J 8 4 2

Negative doubler's rebid. Example 2

Opener shows a fit, but has a minimum opening hand. Your side is not in the game range.

Partner RHO You RHO
1 ♣ 1 ♠ double pass
3 ♥ pass 4 ♥ pass

Negative doubler's rebid. Example 3

Opener shows a fit, and has an invitational hand. With 10 points, you're willing to accept the invitation.

Partner RHO You RHO
1 ♣ 1 ♠ double pass
3 ♣ pass pass pass

★ 5 3 2♥ Q J 9 8♦ 9 8 3♣ A 8 4

Negative doubler's rebid. Example 4

Opener shows an invitational hand, with no fit for your suit. You have no reason to bid any further. . Partner RHO You RHO
1 ♣ 1 ♠ double pass
2 ♣ pass 3 nt pass

A 3 2✓ K Q 9 8✓ Q 8 3A 8 4

Negative doubler's rebid. Example 5

Opener does not have a fit with your suit, but you have game points with a stopper in the opponent's suit. No trump looks like the best game.

Partner RHO You RHO
1 → 1 ♠ double pass
2 ♥ pass 3 ♥ pass

Negative doubler's rebid. Example 6


Opener shows a fit with your suit with your suit, but you don't have enough to bid game. You can make an invitational bid with this hand.

Partner RHO You RHO
1 → 1 ♣ double pass
2 ♥ pass pass pass

▲ J 10 3 2♥ K J 9 8◆ 7 3♣ A 8 4

Negative doubler's rebid. Example 7

Opener shows a minimum hand, and you've found a fit. No reason to bid any more.



Negative doubler's rebid. Example 8

Notice you don't use a negative double, in this case. With 4 spades you can bid the suit at the one level. Partner knows you have 5 cards. Partner RHO You RHO
1 → 1 → double pass
2 ♥ pass pass pass

▲ J 10♥ Q 9 8 7 5 3♦ K 7 3♣ Q 8 4

Negative doubler's rebid. Example 8

You double here even though you have a 5-card suit, because you do not have enough points to bid a suit at the two level.
