Dealing With Opponent's Weak 2 Opening



Why Use Weak 2s?

- One reason is that it interferes with the opponent's auction.
- So, if you are the opponent of a weak 2 bidder, you and your partner need some guidelines for dealing with the damage the weak 2 might have done to your side.
- Whatever you do, you will be taking a risk.
- There is no perfect bid in bridge.

Keep in Mind.

- The weak 2 bidder has a weak defensive hand.
- You know about half of the weak 2 bidder's cards.
- If you become declarer,. That can be important information.

Make a 2-Level Overcall

10+ points and a good 5- or 6-card suit

Advancing Partner's Overcall of Their Weak 2

- You're Sitting West
- North East South West
 - 2♥ 2♠ pass ??
- 3 \bigstar Simple raise = 7-10 points 3 card support
- $3 \checkmark$ Cue bid = limit raise or better.
- 4 ▲ Raise to game = a minimum level opening hand.

A Jump Overcall is a Good Hand

- Don't preempt and preempt
- A Jump overcall is made with a hand that you would have opened 1-level and made a jump response.

A No Trump Overcall

- Absolutely a solid stopper in their suit.
- 2 no trump shows a regular no trump overcall.
- 3 no trump shows a running suit and a good hand.
- There are no transfers after a no trump overcall.
- You know what kind of hand partner has. If you have a suit bid it.
- Some like to use 3 s as Stayman, but you have to know where you are going.

The Takeout Double

- The same as what you would have to make a takeout double of a 1 bid.
 - Solid opening-bid count.
 - Shortness in the weak 2 suit.
 - At least 3 cards in any unbid major suit.
- Also a hand too strong for a jump overcall should start with a double.

Responding to Partner's Takeout Double

- After partner doubles their weak two.
 - 0 to 8 points, make the minimum if you can bid at the two level.
 - Some like to luse 2nt as a relay to 3 clubs either pass or bid a suit. (as version of Lebensohl)
 - 9 to 12 points-invitational- bid directly at the 3 level.
 - 12+ points game bid.
 - A cue bid of the opener's suit asks partner to pick a suit.
