# Lebensohl: The Brief Version

When They Overcall Partner's No Trump
Opening

#### Lebensohl

- Lebensohl is a complex convention.
- It is used when opponents overcall your partner's 1 or 2 no trump opening bid.
- What I am giving you here is a simplified version. There is more to learn.
- If you learn this version, you can handle most situations.

#### Memorize This Phrase

## Slow Shows – Direct Denies

- You must always know what their overcall means.
- If they bid a suit: Is that suit a single suit or is it a two suit bid?
- If the overcall is a double: Is it a single suit or an equal hand?

#### After a Two-Level Overcall

- A double is for penalty.
- Remember, partner has opened 1 no trump. She has a hand full of high cards.
  - If the bid is natural, you can penalize that suit.
  - If it is a two-suit bid you can penalize the suit that is known.
  - A two-level bid is to play. Partner should pass.
  - 2 no trump is a relay to three clubs.

# Some Examples

South's hand

- **♦** K 8
- K J 9
- ♦ Q 8 6 2
- ◆ 9 8 5 2

North east south west 1 nt 2 ♥ dble pass

South's hand

**★** KJ8763

- **y** 9
- ♦ Q 2
- ◆ 9 8 5 2

North east south west 1 nt 2 ♥ 2 ♠ pass pass

# You Can Still Get to 3 No Trump

South's hand

- **★** K Q 8
- **y** J 9
- ♦ Q 8 6 2
- ♣ A 10 5 2

North east south west 1 nt 2 ♥ 3 nt pass

Remember, direct Denies a stopper in their suit.

South's hand

**★** K J 3

**♥** K 8 2

♦ A 8 6 2

**♣**852

North east south west 1 nt 2 ♥ 2 nt pass 3 ♠ pass 3 nt

Slow shows a stopper in their suit.

#### A Point To Remember

- After an opponent interferes, there are no transfers.
- If you bid a suit, you have that suit.
- Except, of course, when you cue bid the opponent's suit. That is Stayman and you are telling partner you have game values.
- Once again, direct denies...slow shows.

# Here Are Some Examples

South's hand

**★** K Q 8 5

**y** 9 3

♦ Q 8 6

♣ A J 9 2

North east south west 1 nt 2 ♥ 3 ♥ pass

Remember, direct denies a stopper in their suit.

South's hand

**★** KJ85

**♥** Q J 3

♦ J 8

♣ Q J 10 9

North east south west 1 nt 2 ♥ 2nt pass 3 ♥

Remember, slow shows a stopper in their suit.

# If You Have the Suit, Bid It

South's hand

- **★** K Q 8 5 3 2
- **y** 9
- ♦ Q 8
- ♣ A J 9 2

South's hand

- **★**85
- ♥ J 10 9 7 5 3
- ◆ A K 3
- ♣ A 9

North east south west 1 nt 2 ♥ 4 ♠ pass

North east south west 1 nt 2 ♣ 4 ♥

#### A Direct 3-Level Bid

- A direct 3-level bid in <u>a major suit</u> is game forcing with a 5-card suit.
  - If you have a 6-card major suit and game points, just bid the game.
- A direct 3-level bid in <u>a minor suit</u> is game forcing, <u>usually</u> with a 6-card suit.
  - If you have a 5-card minor suit and game forcing points, look for a no trump game.
  - Bid 3 of the suit directly, then look for a no trump game.

## Consider the Following Examples

South's hand

- **★** K Q 8 5 3
- **y** 9 3
- ♦ Q 8
- ♣ A J 9 2

North east south west 1 nt 2 ♥ 3 ♠ pass The direct bid shows a 5-card suit with game-going points.

South's hand

- **★** K 5 4
- **y** 9
- ♦ A Q 9 7 5 3
- ♣ A 9 2

North east south west

1 nt 2 ♣ 3 ◆ pass

The direct minor-suit bid shows
6 cards and game going
points.

# Consider the A Few More Examples

South's hand

- **★**85
- **Y** K Q 10 9 3
- ♦ J 8
- ♣ A 10 9 2

North east south west 1 nt 2 ♠ 3 ♥ pass The direct bid shows a 5-card suit with game-going points.

South's hand

- ♠ 9 5
- **Y** K 9 4
- ◆ A 10 9
- ♣ A J 10 9 7

North east south west 1 nt 2 ♠ 3 ♣ pass The direct minor-suit bid usually shows 6 cards and game going points, but might be a 5-card suit. .

#### One Little-Known Provision

- If responder uses the relay, then bids a suit that she could have bid at the two level, she is showing an invitational hand.
- Remember the elements of this provision.
- Responder:
  - Uses the relay 2 nt…3 ♣
  - Then bids a suit that could have been bid at the two level.
- This does not come up often. Some just leave it out.

# Here are Some Examples

South's hand

- **★** KJ9753
- **y** 9 3
- ♦ A 9 7
- **♣**10 5

North east south west

1 nt 2 ♥ 2 nt pass

3 ♣ pass 3 ♠ pass

South could have bid spades at the two level and he could have bid 4 ♠. Instead, he used the relay and then bid his suit. That shows an invitational hand in spades.

South's hand

- **★** 8 5 2
- A 10 9 6 5 4
- **♦** 3
- ♣ A 9 6

North east south west 1 nt 2 → 2nt pass 3 ♥

Again South is inviting game in hearts... North can pass or bid 4 .

# What You Give Up

- When you play this version of Lebensohl, you give up the natural 2 no trump invitational bid.
- After an opponent's overcall, if your intention was to bid 2 no trump to invite partner to game, you can:
  - Pass
  - Double
  - Bid 3 nt.

- A 9 6 4
- **♦** 3
- ♣ A 9 6 5 4

North east south west 1 nt 2 ♥ pass pass

North east south west 1 nt 2 ♣ dble pass

# More Examples

South's hand

**♦** 9 5

♥ Q 10 4

♦ A Q J 9 8

♣ 10 9 8

South's hand

**★** KJ2

**y** 9 6

1098

♣ A J 10 9 5

North east south west 1 nt 2 ♥ 2nt pass 3 ♣ pass 3nt

North east south west 1 nt 2 ♥ 3 nt pass

#### One Last Reminder

- Slow shows....
- Direct denies
