When They Overcall Partner's One No Trump Opening

Consider These Two Hands: Partner Opens 1 No Trump, RHO Bids 2 ♠

Hand A

♠ 9 2

K 9 7 6 5 4

→ J 9 2

4 10 4

Hand B

♠ 10 4

▼ K J 9 8 5

♦ A 9 2

♣ Q J 3

Two Level Bids Are to Play

- Any two-level bid is a drop dead bid.
- Partner is required to pass.
- Any direct 3-level bid is game forcing. We will deal with these bids later.

Partner 1 nt. RHO 2 •

- ♠ 9 2
- K 9 7 6 5 4
- → J 9 2
- ♣ 10 4

The Two No Trump Response

- A response of two no trump is artificial and requires partner to bid 3 ♣.
- Then any bid you make is to play.

Partner 1 nt. RHO 2 ♠

- ♠ 9 2
- K 9 7 6 5 4
- → J 9 2
- **♣** 10 4

The Two No Trump Response

- Two no trump is a relay to 3 ♣.
- In this case you simply pass and partner plays 3 ♣.

Partner 1 nt. RHO 2 ♠

- ♠ 9 2
- **♥** Q 3
- → J 9 2
- ♣ A 10 9 7 4 3

When You Have A 6-Card Suit and Game Points—Just Bid It.

- Partner 1 nt. RHO 2 ♠
- **♦** 9
- KQ7654
- ◆ A 10 9
- ♣ Q J 4

- Partner 1 nt. RHO 2
- **★** A Q 8 5 3 2
- **♥** J 9
- ♦ A J 9 2
- **4**

A Direct, 3-Level Bid is Forcing to Game

- A direct bid at the 3 level shows:
 - Game points
 - A 5-card suit.

North	East	South	West
1nt	2 •	3 🔻	pass

South shows game points with a 5-card heart suit, .

A Direct 3-level Bid is Game Forcing

- Partner 1 nt. RHO 2 ♠
- **♠** 9
- KQ765
- ♦ A 10 9 2
- ♣ Q J 4

- Partner 1 nt. RHO 2
- **AQ832**
- **y** J 9
- ♦ A J 9 2
- **♣** 4 2

3-level Bid is Game Forcing

- Partner 1 nt. RHO 2 ♠
- ♠ 9 2
- K Q
- ♦ A 10 9 2
- ♣ Q J 10 8 4

- Partner 1 nt. RHO 2 V
- **♦** 9 8
- **♥** J 9
- ♦ KQJ952
- ♣ A 8 4

Opener's Rebid After Responder's 3-Level Bid

- The 1 no trump opener knowing his side has game points -- examines his hand to determine the fit. He can:
 - Bid game in the suit bid by responder.
 - Bid 3 no trump with a stopper in the opponent's suit.
 - Cue bid to ask responder if she has a stopper in the opponent's suit.

Opening Bidder's Rebid Ex. 3

Opener's Hand

- **★** K 9
- **♥** J 8 4
- ♦ A K 9 2
- ♣ K Q10 3

1 nt 2 ♥ 3 ♠

A cue bid asks partner for a stopper.

Very difficult ... Discuss

Responder's Direct Bid Denies

- Two direct 3 level bids deny a stopper in the opponent's suit, but show game points.
 - A direct cue bid of the opponent's suit is Stayman, but denies a stopper in the opponents suit.
 - A direct bid of 3 no trump shows game values, but denies both a 4 card major and a stopper in the opponent's suit.

Direct Denies Ex. 1

Responder's Hand

- **v** 8 7
- ♦ A Q 9
- ♣ Q10 9 7

Responder's cue bid is Stayman and denies a stopper.

Direct Denies Ex. 2

Responder's Hand

- **★** KJ8
- **v** 8 7
- ♦ A Q 9 8
- ♣ Q10 9 7

3 🔻

Opn RHO Res 1 nt 2 ♥ 3 nt

Responder's
3nt denies 4
of a major suit
or a stopper,
but shows
game points.

Using the 2 No Trump Relay to Get to Game

- Remember, a 2 no trump response requires partner to bid 3 clubs.
- After opener's 3 club rebid:
 - A cue bid of the opponent's suit is stayman, but shows a stopper.
 - A 3 no trump bid denies a 4-card major suit, but guarantees a stopper in the opponent's suit and shows game points.
