

## Bridge is Not an Exact Science


- In bridge, cards are randomly distributed.
  - Players don't always bid and play in ways that make sense to us.




A Rule to Follow: When you have made a bid and partner asks you to go on, ask yourself the following question: Given what partner knows I have, do I have a maximum or minimum?



North's bid: pass




