# Opener Rebids 2 No Trump 

## Now What?

# First, Let's Look at a One Over One 

 Sequence- 1 ↔... 1 ४... 2 no trump.'
- What sort of hand does opener have?
- Balanced
- 18 or 19 points
- Too strong for a 1 no trump opening
- Not strong enough for a 2 no trump opening


## Should Opener Rebid 2 nt With 4Card Support for Responder?

- No... Supporting partner takes preference.
- Make a 3-level jump rebid. 1 \&... 1 甲... 3 ४
- Or with a good 19, bid game. 1 Һ... 1 ४... 4 ४


## Examples

> - KJ32
> - AKJ5
> - Q J 3

Hand 2

- A 2
- K J 32
- AK 109
*A10 9
1 *... 1 ४... 4


## Should Opener Bid 2 nt With 4Cards in the Other Major?

- Yes... Showing your strength is most important.
- Once your strength is known, there are a number of ways for responder to continue, if her hand warrants continuing.
- Responder can:
- Pass
- Use NMF
- Bid 3nt
- Look for slam


## NMF Over a 2 nt Rebid

- NMF over a $2 n t$ rebid works the same as it does over a 1 nt rebid.
- Responder bids the unbid minor suit, to ask opener about his hand.
- Opener's first responsibility is to show 3-card support for responder's major suit.
- Second responsibility is to show 4-cards in the other major, denying 3 -card support of responder's major suit.
- Third, opener will rebid 3nt.

Show 3-card

Hand 4

- Q 2

- A K10

Show 4 cards in the other major. Denies 3card support for
Responder's minor.

## More Examples

Hand 5
, K 5

- KJ3
- AK 95
*KJ85


2 nt... 3
3 nt
No support for responder's minor and no 4 cards in the other major.

Hand 6

- Q 2
- KJ3
- AK Q 109
*A10 8
1-.. 1 \&...
2 nt... 3
3 .
Shows a really good 5card diamond suit.


## When Should Responder Use NMF?

- First, remember after Opener jumps to two no trump, the only way the pair can stop at a partscore, is for responder to pass 2 nt .
- Responder should use NMF with any hand where opener's response will be helpful.
- This means responder can use NMF with any hand with a 5-card major or with any of the following distributions. 5-4, 4-5 or $4-4$ in the major suits. .


## Consider the Following

Hand 7

- KJ65
- A9 843
- 5
-865


2 nt... 3
Responder wants
to know if opener has either $3 \vee$ or 4 .

Hand 8

- KJ7 2
- AJ 93
- 43
*J 85
1-.. 1 \&...
$2 \mathrm{nt} . .3$
3 -..... 3 nt
Responder wants to know if opener has 4cards in the other major. If opener has 4 hearts he can bid game in hearts.


## Here's What it Looks Like from Opener's Viewpoint

Hand 9

- K J 6
- AK 63
-A 1054
+K 6


Hand 10

- K J 7
$\bullet$ AJ
- AK 43
- Q 1085

pass

Responder bids this way to show either 4-4 or 5-4 in the majors.

# Okay, But What if You Have 5-5 in the Majors? 

Hand 11

- QJ 653
- KQ 872
- 54
- 6

1-.. 1 \&...
2 nt... 3

Responder bids in this way to show 5-5 in the major suits.

Opener will chose a major-suit game or bid 3nt.

## Responder May Pass if that is the Right Bid

Hand 12
-QJ 65

- J 82
- 754
- Q 42

1 -.. 1 \&...
2 nt...pass

Even with this bad hand, partner might make 3nt, but with this dog, you should pass.

## With the Right Stuff, Responder Might Bid Slam

Hand 13

- K J 105
- K J 8
-K 4
- A 942

2 nt... 6nt

Hand 14

- A Q J 10
- Q J 8
- A 4
* K Q 42

1 \& ... 1 ....
2 nt... 7nt

## With the Right Stuff, Responder Might Bid Slam

-KQ82

Hand 16
A AJ 1064

- QJ 87
- A 4
- K 2


## When 3nt is the Correct Bid, Just Bid It.

Hand 17
-AJ105

- Q 8
- J 982
+ 852

1-.. 1 \&...
$2 \mathrm{nt} . . .3 \mathrm{nt}$

## After a 2/1 Response

- Two no trump is bid with one of two hands.
- You will have either:
- 12 to 14 points, balanced distribution
- 18 to 19 points, balanced distribution.
- With 15 to 17 , you will open 1 nt.
- With 20 or 21 , you will open $2 n t$ trump.
