Opener Rebids 2 No Trump

Now What?

First, Let's Look at a One Over One Sequence

- 1 •...1 ♥...2 no trump.'
- What sort of hand does opener have?
 - Balanced
 - 18 or 19 points
 - Too strong for a 1 no trump opening
 - Not strong enough for a 2 no trump opening

Should Opener Rebid 2 nt With 4-Card Support for Responder?

- No... Supporting partner takes preference.
 - Make a 3-level jump rebid. 1 ♦...1 ♥...3 ♥
 - Or with a good 19, bid game. 1 ♦...1 ♥...4 ♥

Examples

Hand 1

- **♦** K 2
- **♥** KJ32
- ◆ A K J 5

Should Opener Bid 2 nt With 4-Cards in the Other Major?

- Yes... Showing your strength is most important.
- Once your strength is known, there are a number of ways for responder to continue, if her hand warrants continuing.
- Responder can:
 - Pass
 - Use NMF
 - Bid 3nt
 - Look for slam

NMF Over a 2 nt Rebid

- NMF over a 2nt rebid works the same as it does over a 1nt rebid.
- Responder bids the unbid minor suit, to ask opener about his hand.
 - Opener's first responsibility is to show 3-card support for responder's major suit.
 - Second responsibility is to show 4-cards in the other major, denying 3-card support of responder's major suit.
 - Third, opener will rebid 3nt.

Show 4 cards in the other major. Denies 3-card support for Responder's minor.

No support for responder's minor and no 4 cards in the other major.

Hand 6

- **♠** Q 2
- **♥** K J 3
- ♦ AKQ109
- ♣ A 10 8

2 nt...3 ♣

3 🔷

Shows a really good 5-card diamond suit.

When Should Responder Use NMF?

- First, remember after Opener jumps to two no trump, the only way the pair can stop at a partscore, is for responder to pass 2 nt.
- Responder should use NMF with any hand where opener's response will be helpful.
- This means responder can use NMF with any hand with a 5-card major or with any of the following distributions. 5-4, 4-5 or 4-4 in the major suits.

Consider the Following

Responder wants to know if opener has either 3 \(\nsime\) or 4 \(\nsime\).

Hand 8

Responder wants to know if opener has 4-cards in the other major. If opener has 4 hearts he can bid game in hearts.

Here's What it Looks Like from Opener's Viewpoint

Responder bids this way to show either 4-4 or 5-4 in the majors.

Okay, But What if You Have 5-5 in the Majors?

Hand 11

- **♠** Q J 6 5 3
- ▼ K Q 8 7 2
- **♦** 5 4
- **♣** 6
- 1 **♦**... 1 **♠** ... 2 nt...3 **♥**

Responder bids in this way to show 5-5 in the major suits.

Opener will chose a major-suit game or bid 3nt.

Responder May Pass if that is the Right Bid

Hand 12

- **♠** Q J 6 5
- ♥ J 8 2
- ♦ 7 5 4
- Q 4 2

1 **♦**... 1 **♠** ... 2 nt...pass

Even with this bad hand, partner might make 3nt, but with this dog, you should pass.

With the Right Stuff, Responder Might Bid Slam

Hand 13

♠ KJ 10 5

Y K J 8

♦ K 4

♣ A 9 4 2

1 **♦**... 1 **♠** ... 2 nt... 6nt

Hand 14

♠ A Q J 10

♥ Q J 8

♦ A 4

♣ K Q 4 2

1 **♦**... 1 **♠** ... 2 nt... 7nt

With the Right Stuff, Responder Might Bid Slam

Hand 15

- **A** J 10 5 4
- **Y** K J 8
- ♦ K Q 8 2
- **♣** 2

- 1 ♦... 1 ♠ ...
- 2 nt... 3 ♣
- 3 ★ ... 4nt

Hand 16

- ♠ AJ 10 6 4
- ♥ Q J 8 7
- ♦ A 4
- **♣** K 2

1 ♦... 1 ★ ...

2 nt... 3 ♣

3 ♥ ... 4nt

When 3nt is the Correct Bid, Just Bid It.

Hand 17

- **♠** A J 10 5
- **♥** Q 8
- ♦ J 9 8 2
- **★**852

```
1 ♦... 1 ♠ ...
```

2 nt... 3 nt

After a 2/1 Response

- Two no trump is bid with one of two hands.
- You will have either:
 - 12 to 14 points, balanced distribution
 - 18 to 19 points, balanced distribution.
- With 15 to 17, you will open 1nt.
- With 20 or 21, you will open 2nt trump.
