## When an Opponent Overcalls at the Two Level



## Basic Guidelines

- Double is negative, through the level you and your partner have agreed.
- New-Suit Bids promise partner $10+$ points and 5+ cards in the suit. If you play $2 / 1$, you promise $12+$ points.
- Cue Bid promises 11+ points and 3+ card support.
- Jump Shift promises 6+ cards with fewer than 10 points.
- No Trump Bids are natural and guarantee a stopper in the opponent's suit.

## The Penalty Pass

- Whenever you open the bidding with a 1 level suit bid, your LHO makes a suit overcall, your partner passes and your RHO passes, you must consider reopening with a double.
- When you reopen with a double, you are not saying you want to defend the contract. You are asking partner the question: Do you want to defend this contract?
- Responder's pass is sometime called a Trap Pass.

## $2 \ldots(2 \vee) \ldots ?$

- People don't overcall a 2 opening bid very often, but it happens occasionally.
- Best ignore the overcall. Just make your normal bid.
- Of course, you don't have to bid to keep the auction open for partner.
- You can pass, listen for your partner's bid than bid accordingly.


## $2 \ldots(2 \vee) \ldots ?$

- Keep it simple.
- Pass with 4 or fewer points.
- Double with 5-7 points.
- Bid a decent 5-card or longer suit with 8 or more points.
- Bid no trump with a solid stopper in the opponent's suit and 8+ points.
- Talk it over with partner, but an overcall of $2 \boldsymbol{2}$ happens so seldom, good luck in remembering.
