Evaluating Shortness



What is the Value of a Short Suit?

- As with most things in bridge it depends...
 - What suit is short
 - And which hand contains the short suit.
 - Consider the following suit as trump:
 - AKQJ10
 752

Now Imagine You Have this Hand









Consider Two Auctions



Points to Keep in Mind

- The more trump you have, the more valuable your short suits.
- Shortness in an unbid suit is usually good.
- Shortness in a suit partner has bid naturally is probably bad.
- Shortness in declarer's hand is of dubious value.
- Shortness in dummy is often very good.

Revalue Your Hand As Dummy

- If you have a fit with partner and your hand will be dummy, a short suit is valuable.
- The more trump you have, the more valuable your short suit.
- With 4 trump, revalue in the following way:
 - A void = 5 points
 - A Singleton = 3 points
 - A doubleton = 1 point
