# New Minor Forcing 

## A Very Helpful Convention

## The Basic Idea

- This popular convention is used when the OPENER rebids 1NT or 2NT, after opening with a minor suit.
- Responder rebids a new minor,
- An artificial bid asking if opener has 3 cards in responder's major suit.
- Each of the following auctions is the new minor forcing convention. It specifically asks the opener if she has 3 cards in the responder's major suit.

In each of the following auctions, "*" indicates the New Minor Forcing Convention.

## The New Minor Forcing Bid

- Is on only when opponents are silent.
- Is always used by the responder.
- Is responder's second bid in the auction.
- Responder has 9 or more points.
- Responder has five cards in the major suit.
- Responder needs more information to decide if the final contract will be the major suit or no trump.


## New Minor Forcing is Alerted

- When the New Minor Forcing convention is initiated, the opener must say "alert."
- If opponents ask for the meaning of the alert, opener should say.
- The minor suit is artificial.
- Asking if opener has 3 of the major.


## Opening Bidder's Response Options

- After New Minor Forcing is initiated, opener may:
a. Bid two of the responder's major suit with three cards.
b. If responder has bid spades, opener may bid hearts with 12 or 13 points not three spades.
c. If responder has bid hearts, opener will bid spades, with 12 or 13 points and not three hearts.
d. Opener bids two no trump without 3 cards in responder's major suit and 14 points.
