What Does a Two Club Opening Look Like?

- Balanced hand: 22+ points
- Unbalanced hand– Count tricks, not points -- 9 tricks in the hand.

Some Examples

♠ A K Q
♥ A K 3
♦ K Q 10
♣ Q 10 7 3

- Balanced hand
- 23 points
- Open 2 ♣
- Plan to rebid 2 no trump.

Some Examples

♠ A K Q 9 8 7
♥ A K 3
♦ A 3 2
♣ 3

- 9 Tricks
 - 6 spades
 - 2 hearts
 - 1 diamond
- Open with 2 ♣ and rebid 2 ♠.

Some Examples

♠ 7
♥ K Q J 3
♦ A K
♣ A K J 10 8 3

- 9 Tricks
 - 5 clubs
 - 2 diamonds
 - 2 hearts
- Open with 2 ♣ and rebid 3 ♣.

Responses to a 2 Opening Bid

- There are a number of response systems. The three most common are:
 - 2  “Waiting” (most popular)
 - 2  Waiting with 2  as immediate negative.
 - 2  is waiting but shows at least 4 points.
 - 2  shows 0-3 points.
 - Control showing step responses.

2 ♦ “Waiting” System Responses

- 2 ♦ Shows 0-7 points
- 2 ♥ Shows 8+ points and a 5-card or better suit.
- 2 ♠ Shows 8+ points and a 5-card or better suit.
- 2 nt Shows 8+ points and a balanced hand.
- 3 ♣ Shows 8+ points and a 5-card or better suit.
- 3 ♦ Shows 8+ points and a 5-card or better suit.

Shows 0-7 HCP.

with 5-card suit

Opening Bidder's Rebid After 2

- With a balanced hand: (2  ...2 )
 - 22-24 points bid 2 nt.
 - 25-27 points bid 3 nt.
 - 28-30 points bid 4 nt.

Responder's Rebid After(2 ♣
...2 ♦ ...2nt)

You don't need much to be in game

- With 3-7 points and no 4 card major suit bid 3 nt.
- 3 ♣ clubs is Stayman.
- With a 5 card or longer major suit, you can transfer.

Opening Bidder's Rebid After 2

- With an unbalanced hand: (2  ...2 )
 - Just bid your suit.
 - Let partner help you find the best contract.

Opener's Rebid After A Positive Response

- If responder's bid is 2nt, showing 8+ points with a balanced hand.
- Opener may use Stayman to find a 4-4 major suit fit.
- **The strong hand never transfers to the weak hand.**
- If opener has a suit of his/her own, they must bid it and let responder help find the best contract.

What Do You Do With a Really Weak Hand?

- Some partnerships like to have a second negative bid to show a really poor hand (0-3 points).
 - The cheapest available minor
 - 3 nt when no minor is available at the 3 level.

Second Negative Examples

3 ♣ (0-3 points no fit for spades)

Opener Responder

3 ♦ (Cheapest available minor 0-3 points no fit for clubs)

Second Negative Examples

Opener	Responder
2 ♣	2 ♦
3 ♦	3 nt (No minor suit available at the three level, 0-3 points no fit for diamonds)

**Second negative only on over
openers' suit response. It is off when
opener rebids no trump.**
