# Responder's Rebid After Responding to 1 No Trump

#### Partner Opens 1 No Trump

- We are going to examine responders' second bid after they have made an initial response to their partner's opening 1 no trump bid.
  - Stayman
  - Transfer
- Remember when partner opens 1 no trump, you're the boss. You must guide the partnership to the best contract.

- You can pass with hands like this.
- If partner had bid 2 or 2 , you would pass.
- You can also do the same thing with a 4-4-4-1 and a singleton club.
- Use this bid with a hand up to 6 or 7 hcps.

- Crawling Stayman.
- After two diamonds, 2 instructs partner to pass with 3 hearts or bid 2 with 3 cards in that suit.
- The assumption here is that partner will have at least one 3-card major suit.

- Invitational with at least one 4-card major.
- Partner will know you have 4 spades and bid accordingly.
- Opener can decline the invitation with:
  - Pass
  - **-** 3 ♠.
- Accept the invitation with:
  - 3 nt.
  - **4**

**Invitational Hand** 

- This is a conventional way of handling this holding. It does not show a weak hand.
- It shows specifically 5 spades, 4 hearts, a short suit, and invitational values.
- Talk it over with partner. Since it does not come up often, you might review the idea before your game.
- Of course, if you did not have 4 hearts, you would just transfer to spades and bid 2no trump to invite.

- The Smolen convention. Game forcing points. 5-4 in the major suits.
- After 2 
   , jump in your 4-card major.

- Invitational... shows a heart fit
- If partner had bid 2 or 2 •, you would bid 2 nt to invite game.

- If partner had bid 2 ♦ or 2 ♥, you would be 2 nt to invite game.

- Sign off
- Tells partner you have game values and no interest in slam.

- Tells partner to bid 6 nt with 17 points.
- Otherwise pass

- Confirms a spade fit.
- Depending on partnership agreement
  - A splinter, if you have agreed to play splinters, showing shortness in clubs and slam interest.
  - Or a control bid showing first or second round control of the club suit and slam interest.
- This is not Gerber.

- Without a suit fit, use 4 as Gerber.
- You have enough points for a slam, but need to confirm that your side has adequate controls.

- A K 10 9 8 2

- Transfer to clubs, then bid 3 no trump.
- Tells partner you have an interest in a minor suit slam.
- If the spade holding was J 4 3, you would simply bid 3 nt, without the transfer.
- Must be playing 4-suit transfers.

#### 1 nt...3 • ...3 • ...3nt

- **♠** K Q 2
- **Y** K 3
- A Q 10 8 5 3
- **8** 8 2

- Transfer to diamonds, then bid 3 no trump.
- Tells partner you have an interest in a minor suit slam.
- If the spade holding was J 4 3, you would simply bid 3 nt, without the transfer.
- Must be playing 4-suit transfers.
