What is a Reverse

- In bridge, a reverse is a type of bid by opener that shows extra strength.
- It shows a moderately strong opening hand (17 to 19+ points) and an unbalanced hand.

What is a Reverse?

 In general, a reverse (with a couple of exceptions) strongly suggests that your first suit is longer than your second suit.

- **4**
- A K 3 2
- **K** 10 5
- **AK834**

Rules for Reversing

- Your hand is unbalanced, so you cannot make a no trump rebid.
- You do not have 4-card support for partner's major suit.
- Your second suit is of higher rank than your first suit.
- Your second suit is shorter than your first suit.(with a couple of relatively rare exceptions).
- You have a strong hand worth 16+ (or 17+) points.

Two Exceptions to the Distribution Requirements

- **4**
- A K 3 2
- **♦** KJ 10 5
- **AK83**

1-4-4-4 distribution is a difficult hand to bid.

- **5** 2
- A K J 2
- **♦** 862
- **AKQ3**

2-4-3-4 or 3-4-2-4 Distribution.

- 4
- **AK32**
- ♦ KQJ105
- **A** 83

Responding to a Reverse

- A reverse is forcing for one round. Not necessarily forcing to game.
- However, a reverse shows a good hand, so responder must be aware.

Responding to a Reverse (1)

- With a weak hand (6-8 points), you might:
 - With 3 card support raise partner's first suit.

```
North East South West
1 ♣ pass 1 ♠ pass
2 ♥ pass 3 ♣
```

- Shows a weak hand.
- Non-forcing, but partner may bid on.

Responding to a Reverse (2)

- With a weak hand (6-8 points), you might:
 - With a control in the unbid suit bid 2 no trump.
 - North East South West
 1 ♣ pass 1 ♠ pass
 2 ♥ pass 2nt
- Shows a control in diamonds.
- Non-forcing, but partner may bid on.

Responding to a Reverse (3)

- With a weak hand (6-8 points), you might:
 - With 4-card support make a simple raise of partner's second suit.

North	East	South	West
-1 ♣	pass	1 🌲	pass
- 2 ♦	pass	3 🔷	

- Shows 4-card support for diamonds.
- Non-forcing, but partner may bid on.

Responding to a Reverse (4)

- With a weak hand (6-8 points), you might:
 - With 5+ cards and neither of the first two options available, you can rebid your suit.

```
North East South West
1 ♣ pass 1 ♠ pass
2 ♥ pass 2 ♠
```

- Shows at least 5 spades.
- Non-forcing, but partner may bid on.

Responding to a Reverse (5)

- With a strong hand (9+ points).
 - With 3+ card support, jump raise partner's first suit.

• 4 • here is forcing to game.

Responding to a Reverse (6)

- With a strong hand (9+ points).
 - With 9-12 points and a control in the 4th suit, bid
 3nt.

North	East	So	uth	West
1 🔷	pas	S	1 🏚	pass
2 💙	pas	SS	3nt	

 You intend to play 3 no trump, but partner might bid on to try for slam.

Responding to a Reverse (7)

- With a strong hand (9+ points).
 - With 4-card support, you might jump raise partner's second suit.

North	East	So	uth	West
1 🔷	pas	S	1 🌲	pass
2 💙	pas	SS	4 💙	

• 4 is to play, but partner might go on to look for a slam.

Responding to a Reverse (8)

- With a strong hand (9+ points).
- With 4 cards in the unbid suit, bid that suit.

```
North East South West

1  pass 1 pass
2 pass 2
```

• 2 is forcing to game and shows 5 spades and 4 hearts. Partner will know your distribution and decide what to do.

Responding With 6-8 points

Non-forcing responses

- Support partner's first suit.
- Support partner's second suit.
- Bid 2 no trump.
- Rebid your suit.

Responding With 9+ Points

- Forcing to game responses.
- Jump raise partner's first suit
- Jump raise partner's second suit.
- Bid 3 no trump.
- Bid the 4th suit.
