- More people are being taught bridge in our clubs and work is being done by some clubs to assist beginners in the transition from lessons to club duplicates. We have more daytime bridge sessions in our clubs. The youth programme is flourishing.

- Yes, we have provided grants to clubs to assist with teacher training, purchased duplimate machines and run tester sessions. Abbey Smith, the proprietor of a club that has been successful in this area, was invited to share her ideas with others. The county also supports the youth programme.

- Highlights must be the work done by Barbara Jordan and her team in making a success of Cafe Bridge and the work done by Joan Bennett, Alison Nicolson and Holly Kilpatrick in developing junior bridge both in schools and in two county clubs.

- Yes. Full committee and financial support for both enterprises. The cafe bridge is self-financing. We have a budget of £1500 pa to support the juniors initiatives.

Subject to minor changes we have had these objectives in place for four to five years and have made modest progress towards some but not all of them. Their importance is in agreeing what we would like to achieve whenever it can be done. Their achievement depends largely on finding people with the ability and determination to make any one objective happen.

10: Please outline the things which you think your county does well for your clubs and individual members

In addition to the ongoing work on expanding our services to include the social player and on fostering junior bridge I think we provide a reasonable range of competitions for the more seriously competitive player and the county team arrangements are well managed (even if there are always going to be those dissatisfied with the selectors!) Opportunities to learn bridge in Oxfordshire have grown.

11 : Please outline the things which your county would like to do better

We need to help our clubs to attract new members. In many clubs duplicates can be too daunting for the inexperienced player and they need help with setting up transition duplicates for the less experienced. Another area that we have started working on is that of improving is communication with our members, both by closer targeting and by greater economy with words. Emails from the county probably go straight to junk mail in most cases. Our governance arrangements need attention - UM doubled the number of representatives that each club was permitted on the Management Committee and we need to arrange that most day-to-day decisions can be dealt with by a much smaller executive committee. This and other changes follow from carrying out a Best Practice review based on the recent CWG document.
