

## Using Play it Again

Click on Latest Results (or whatever session you're interested in), and click on the name of a participant, and the boards will be displayed as below.

View Larger Play it again

Click on the Play it again button and the Play it Again window should appear. Click on the BS online option.

**Play it Again!!**

You can view this hand and play it again in your favourite "Play it Again!!" software. There are a number of software packages available to do this. **Please see the Guide for further details.**

Simply, click the appropriate button and follow the instructions.

- [PC] - Create a file to open directly in the "Play it Again!!" software installed on your PC. You will need to click, usually, [Open] and then the software will display.
- [BS Online] - Use Bridge Solver Online to analyse winning lines of play interactively on any PC, Mac, smartphone, or tablet. This opens immediately in this Window.

Bridgewebs will remember the Viewer after the first time, click [Switch Viewer] to return here and use a different viewer.

Now the Bridge Solver Online window should appear. Click on any of the contracts in the bottom right box (even the ones marked with - ) and the opening leader's hand will be highlighted as below.

Switch Viewer Open Window Close

You can then step through the hand card by card by clicking on a card. The number next to the card indicates the number of tricks that hand and its partner can take if that card is played. Green indicates the card or cards that should be played to make the maximum number of tricks for the partnership at that point in time.

If you click the denomination that was actually played at the table, it will tell you in the top right hand box what the contract and opening lead were. In the example above, clicking on 1 spade by E shows that the contract was actually 2SX and the opening lead was 9 clubs (denoted by an asterisk).
