It's certainly not just for boffins. We have regular sessions for players of all levels (and all ages!)

About the session

We will try to keep the theory to a minimum and spend most of the time having fun playing real hands. This will give you a chance to use the bidding boxes, see how the scoring system works and see how you fare overall. There will be a prize for the winner of each round.
