Q1: Would you have entered the auction at any point as South?

Q2: What are the respective merits of leading partner's suit vis a vis your singleton club?

You choose to lead partner's suit - he overtakes and leads another diamond, declarer ruffing.

Trick 1: you lead 10♦: 10-4-J-8

Trick 2: Partner leads A .: A -2 -7 -9

Q3: What is the remaining diamond position?

Declarer crosses to dummy with a club, and plays a trump, partner contributing the Queen.

Trick 3: declarer leads 2 \(\ 2 \cdot 2 \cdot 7 - A - 3 \)
Trick 4: dummy leads 4 \(\ \ \ 2 \cdot 8 \cdot 4 \cdot 4 \cdot 9 \cdot 4 \cdot 4 \cdot 9 \cdot 8 \cdot 4 \cdot 4 \cdot 9 \cdot 8 \cdot 8

Q4: What is the remaining trump position?

You lead a heart, partner winning the Ace

Trick 5: you lead 6 ♥: 6-10-A-2

Q5: Who holds the J♥?

Partner continues with the master diamond, declarer ruffing with the 94.

Trick 6 starts: K♦ from partner: K♦-94-?

Q6: What is your general defensive plan?


Q7: Do you overruff or discard on this trick, and if the former how do you continue?

Post Mortem

Q8: Do you agree with the opposition's bidding decisions?

Q9: Could declarer have played better?

Q10: How would partner have fared in a diamond contract?



Q1: Do you agree with South's decision to double at the second turn?

Trick 1 - partner leads 5 ♥: 5-8-A-4

Q2: What choices do you consider at Trick 2?

Trick 2 - Say you continue with K♦, which wins: K-5-4-2

Q3: What choices do you consider at Trick 3?

Say you continue with J^{\bullet} and declarer wins the King - Trick 3 you lead J^{\bullet} : J-K-7-9

Q4: What are your thoughts about the remaining heart position?

Declarer now plays two rounds of trumps ending in hand

Trick 4: declarer leads 5 ♠: 5-4-K-2

Trick 5: dummy leads 3 ♠: 3 ♠-2 ♠-A♠-Q♠

Now declarer leads J♣ from hand: J-4-3

Q5: What are your thoughts about the possible club layouts?



Q1: Do you agree with South's bidding decisions?

Partner leads 5 ♠ which you win with your Ace.

Trick 1: partner leads 5 ♠: 5-4-A-6

Q2: Assuming you are playing standard leads, you can definitively work out that partner led a singleton. How?

Q3: How exactly do you continue the defence from this point?

Q4: Do you agree with West's competition to $2 \clubsuit$? A related question - suppose declarer had been able to draw your side's trumps quickly, would she have likely made 8 tricks in a spade contract?
