Bidding with Suits recap

- If you have 12-19 points you open at the one level
- You can open with 11 points if the hand meets the rule of 20
- If you have a hand suitable for 1NT open it, if not bid a suit
- Open your longest suit
- With 2 suits of equal length open the higher ranking
-exception with 4-4 in the majors open 1 heart

Supporting Partner's Suit

- With five points or fewer PASS
- When partner opens one of a major and you have 4+ fit raise:

6-9 pts raise to the two level

10-12 pts raise to the three level









13+ pts raise to the four level

With a fit found points can be added for shape

Responding to Partner's One of a Suit

When NOT to raise your partner's suit:

- When you don't have 4 of his suit
- When he has opened a minor and you have 4 of a major

Partner opens 1D (he has not denied 4 of a major)

You bid 1S rather than support his diamonds immediately

Responding to Partner's One of a Suit with a new suit

If you cannot support partner's suit or if partner's suit is a minor and you have a major, bid your own suit.

Rules

- Bid your major if you have one. Only bid a longer minor if you are 13+
- With two 5 card suit or two 6 card suits bid the higher ranking suit first
- With two 4 card suits bid cheapest first

Responding to Partner's One of a Suit with a new suit

- To change suit over your partner's one bid and bid at the 2 level requires 10+pts eg 1S-2C, exceptionally 9.
- When you bid at the 2 level you are still only promising a minimum 4 cards suit
 - exception 1S-2H promises at least 5 hearts

Responding to Partner's One of a Suit with 1NT

- A general purpose bid that says:
- I have fewer than 4 cards in your suit so I cannot support it
- I have at least six points
- I am not strong enough to bid my own suit at the two level
- I have no suit I can bid at the one level

Note:

A response of 1NT is different to opening 1NT. Opening 1NT requires a balanced hand a 1NT response does not.

You can bid at the 2 level with fewer than nine points if you are supporting a suit. Introducing a new suit requires extra points.

No Trump responses to opening bid

Must have fewer than 4 cards in partner's suit

Must not have a 4 card major to bid (must have 5 hearts in sequence 1S – 2H)

Eg. Over partner's opening 1S

1NT = 6-9 may not be balanced

2NT = 10-12 balanced hand

3NT = 13-15 balanced hand

Supporting partner's suit

Must have 4 or more cards in partner's suit. If supporting a minor then no biddable major of your own.

Eg. Over partner's opening 1S

2S = 6-9

3S = 10-12

4S = 13-15

Responding to Partner's One of a Suit Recap

When partner opens 1 of a suit you can:

1. Pass – fewer than 6 pts
2. Support suit with 4+, level of support dependent on points
3. Bid No Trumps
4. Bid a new suit





2 and 3 are LIMIT bids. Partner is in charge of the auction.
4 is UNLIMITED and is FORCING for one round partner
MUST bid again

Opener's Rebid

If partner changes suit you **MUST** rebid.
Therefore it is important to think of your
rebid when making your first bid.





Opener's Rebid with a weaker (12-14pts) hand

- Rebid of your own suit says weak hand at least 5 in suit

Opener's Rebid with a weaker (12-14pts) hand

- You can bid a new lower ranking suit, or any suit at the one level, thus offering partner a choice.

	You	Partner

Opener's Rebid with a weaker (12-14pts) hand

- Support partner's suit at lowest possible level.
You need at least four cards of partner's suit.

Opener's Rebid with a weaker (12-14pts) hand

- You can pass but only if your partner has made a limit bid by supporting your suit or bidding No Trumps

	You	Partner
 A 9 4 2	1 H	2 H
 A Q J 7 6	pass

Responder's second bid

- Once opener has bid twice his hand will be reasonably well defined therefore responder is in the best position to decide the final contract eg

	You	Partner
 K 9 5		1 S
 A Q J 6 3	2 H	2 S

Making a Choice

- If partner bids 2 suits you are being offered a choice. You must make a decision. Passing effectively chooses his second suit. Because partner will always open his longest suit you should only support his second suit if your cards in that suit are substantially better than his first suit eg.

Your partner opens 1 H you have:

♠	10 9 7 6 4
♥	9 2
♦	Q 5
♣	K J 6 3

You respond? 1 S

He now rebids 2 D (offering 2 suits)

What do you bid? 2 H

Opener's Rebid with Weak (12-14pt) Hand

- Support partner's suit at lowest level (must have 4+ support)
- Rebid own suit at lowest level – promises at least 5 cards
- Bid a new suit lower ranking than the first
- Bid any 4 card suit at the one level

If you bid one of a suit you are promising a rebid if partner changes suit (he is unlimited)
