4-4-4-1 Hands

Notoriously difficult to deal with

Fortunately not common

You will (probably) need to lie





Lying about a minor is a small crime

Lying about a major is a big crime

With a 4-4-4-1 Hand open a minor

4-4-4-1 Hands

With a 4-4-4-1 hand plan your rebid on the likelihood that partner will respond in your singleton suit, if he doesn't rejoice!

WEAK

1 C – 1 D – 1 H
(shows 5 clubs 4 hearts)

1 C – 1 H – 3H

STRONG


1 C – 1 D – 2H
(Shows 5 clubs 4 hearts forcing)

4-4-4-1 Hands

Sometimes better just to pass

Dealer, vulnerable
pass!

Open 1C

Initially downgrade a 4-4-4-1 hand by 1 or 2 points

With 2 minors open a diamond

Open 1 Diamond planning
to rebid in clubs

With 2 minors and 16/17 open a Diamond

Open 1 Diamond planning
to rebid in NT eg:
1D – 1S – 1NT

Assuming partner responds in singleton suit

4-4-4-1	2 minors	1 minor
Weak (12-15)	Open 1 D Rebid 2 C	Open 1C/1D Rebid 2C/2D
Intermediate (16-17)	Open 1 D Rebid 1 NT	Open 1C/1D Rebid 1 NT
Strong (18+)	Open 1D Rebid 2 major	Open 1C/1D Rebid 2 major

Unless a fit is found 4-4-4-1 hands are worth less

1 C – 1 NT

- 8-10 points 4-3-3-3 shape
- 6-7 points 4-3-3-3 shape bid 2 Clubs

Shows balanced hand 15-16pts

If partner has enough points for game and 3 spades he bids 3 spades (forcing). You reply 4 S

You rebid 2NT

If partner has enough points for game and 3 spades he bids 3 spades (forcing). You bid 3 NT

Finding the Major Fit

- 1 S 12+ points, 4+ spade suit
- 2 D 10+ points, 4+ diamonds, not 4 spades
- 2 NT 15-16 points balanced (does not deny 5 card spades)
- 3 S Enough points for game I have 3 spades
- 3 NT/4S Bids 4 S with 5 Spades 3NT with 4 Spades
