Defender's Tip – Attitude Signals

When defender has a choice of cards to play,

A high card is an encouraging signal

A low card is discouraging signal

Defender's Tip – Attitude Signals

The following cards are held:

North - ♥ A 4
East - ♥ K 8 2
South - ♥ 9 7 6 3
West - ♥ Q J 10 5

If South is Declarer in No Trump,

Who leads?

What card do they lead?

What does it mean?

Defender's Tip – Attitude Signals

**If South is declarer in No Trump and West has
The lead, which card would west lead?**

♥ Q

What information does this card tell east?

West has the J and 10 of hearts

West does not have the K of Hearts

South wins the trick in North's hand with the Ace

What message would East like to send West?

East likes hearts

Defender's Tip – Attitude Signals

Which card should east discard to encourage West to lead hearts again?

With a choice between ?

♥ 8 ♥ 2

East must discard the ♥ 8 to encourage partner to lead the heart suit again.

There is a guideline for second hand play (North)
The general guideline when you are second hand to play to a trick is to play a low card and give your partner a chance to win the trick.

Review - Opening Lead and Third Hand Play

- **Against a No Trump contract** – lead your longest and strongest suit.

Top of a Sequence (should be 3 in NT)

Fourth highest from your longest and strongest

Review – Opening Lead and Third Hand Play

- **Against a Suited contract** – leading your longest and strongest suit may not be as effective because of the opponents trump suit.

The top of a sequence is always a good lead

A short suit will sometimes be effective.

Review – Opening Lead and Third Hand Play

Third Hand Play

When Playing third to a trick, if partner's card
Is not winning, play third hand high

Unless there is something clearly better to
do, return partner's lead.

Priorities for Opening Bid

13 or more points (valuation plus length)

1) One No Trump Opening Bid

15 to 17 High Card Points

Balanced Hand

2) Major Suit opening

5 card major suit

If two 5 card suits, bid the highest first

3) Minor Suit opening

Usually 4 diamonds or 3 clubs minimum

One No Trump Opening Bid

15 to 17 High Card and Length Points

Balanced Hand

No Voids

No Singletons,

At most, one Doubleton

Bidding Messages from Responder

Signoff – asks partner to pass in a part score

Invitational – Invites partner to bid game

Forcing – Asks (forces) partner to bid again

Partner has opened 1 No Trump

Responder has 0-7 points and a
5 card or longer suit

In general, with a five card or longer suit, responder will choose to play with that suit as trumps when the partnership belongs in part score. Responder bids:

2 Diamonds

2 Hearts

2 Spades

Opening bidder must pass these bids.

These are called signoff bids

What about clubs? 2 clubs is reserved for another bid

Responding to One No Trump Opening Bid

Deciding **How High?** Do the Math! **Where?**

0 to 7 Points – Part Score (not enough for game)

Pass or play in a suit contract at the 2/3 level Use a **signoff** bid

8 to 9 Points – Invitational

Invite Game - for example, bid 2 No Trump

10 to 15 Points – Game

Play in **3 No Trump or 4 of a Major**

The 1 ♥ and 1 ♠ Opening Bid

If you have enough strength to open the bidding, but your hand does not meet the requirements of opening 1 No Trump, the next priority is to decide if your hand qualifies to open in a major suit.

13 to 21 Valuation Points

A five card or longer major suit

Responder's First Choice – Showing Support

6 or more points

At least three card of partner's suit

Bid 2 of partner's suit

Your partner has opened 1 of a Major Suit

**Responder's Second Choice – A New Suit – Forcing
(responder is an un-passed hand)**

Responding at the One Level

6 or more points

A four card or longer suit

Your partner has opened 1 of a Major Suit

Responding at the Two Level

13 or more points

At least a 3 card suit to respond 2 ♣ or 2 ♦

At least a 5 card suit to respond 2 ♥

Unless everyone has passed, opener will have another chance to bid and further describe the strength and distribution of his hand.

Opener's rebid will depend upon whether responder:

Raised opener's major

Bid a new suit

Bid No Trump

Called “bidding up the ladder”

The new suit by responder is a forcing bid as responder has not limited his hand.

Opener must bid something. Options are:

Raising responder's suit with support

Bidding a new suit at the one level

Bidding a new suit at the two level

Bidding No Trump shows balanced hand

Rebidding opener's original suit

Medium Hand – 17 to 18 points - Raise to three level
