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**These pesky computer dealt hands:**

♠ A Q J 4 3  
♥ -  
♦ 6  
♣ A K J 10 9 6 3

North dealt and opened 2 Clubs with their big two-suiter. A non-vulnerable East, probably wondering what was going on, overcalled **2 Hearts** raised to **4** by partner after south passed. 4 spades then by North anxious not to miss the 10 trick game, doubled by East with this being taken out by a worried West who thought **5H** might make, might save, might be a mite less risky than a doubled vulnerable game. South maintained a resolute silence throughout.

5 clubs (or 5 spades) is obviously a cakewalk without being bid but have a think about 6 clubs – the **ace of diamonds** is an obvious lead but imagine the pain of a careless **ace of hearts**, ruffed, trumps drawn and the **diamond loser** going away on the **King of hearts**. Vulnerable against not – the joy of sending **5 hearts** one down (not even doubled) was probably inadequate after the thrill of picking up North's hand.

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**There's a whole lot of bidding going on....**

South deals and after two passes North opens 1NT

1NT – 2H (hearts and a minor) – X – P – 3D – P – 3S – P – 3NT - P –  
P – X – 4D – P – P - X - p-p-p

The 4D looked like a nervousness about hearts but with no guarantee of a fit the diamonds would work just as well in NT and at a level lower to boot .... Guessing the blockages would get declarer home but there would be some heart in the mouth moments on the way.

The other table found their spade fit although the split cannot have pleased declarer but going only one off undoubled was a sight better than the two-off vulnerable at this table. A return of 9 imps for EW was decisive in an otherwise close match.
