Taster Session at Cannington/Bridgwater Bridge Clubs

Here's a fun hand from a County League match between Wells and Yeovil.

At love all, you are West and first to bid holding:-

S void

H 84

D AKQJ10654

C Q42

One table tried a gambling 3NT, whilst the other pre-empted even more vigorously with 5D. It made no difference. Over the 5D opening North bid 5S. Over 3NT, North bid 4S and, when West then bid 5D, went on to 5S. So the contract was the same at both tables. As was the result - making plus 1.

Here is the full deal.

AKQ10532 AQJ 97 Κ void J84 84 96 AKQJ10654 void **Q42** AJ1098753 976 K107532 832 6

After the lead of **AC**, East is unable to lead a D and so North can draw trumps and discard his losing diamonds on dummy's hearts; **6S** is unbeatable.

If West had ventured on to 6D, it is likely that North would lead a spade and West makes all the tricks by discarding his losing diamonds on partner's clubs. If after 6D North had decided to bid on to 6S and West 'saved' in 7D, then North should lead AH rather than AS as with less hearts the AH is a better bet to hold than the AS. In 6D the AH risks setting up opponent's potential KH.

As **6S** is making, the par score is **7D** doubled which is 2 off for minus 500.

If over West's opening 3NT North decides to double and West decides to complete the gamble by passing this, he loses all the tricks for 9 off and minus 2,300! Note that if North passes 3NT it would also result in 9 off; minus 450 for a 1 imp gain for West over 4 or 5S making 6.
