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President's Introduction

As you will appreciate, the bridge world is currently in as much Covid-19 turmoil as the rest of the country. The issues are unprecedented and the situation is changing rapidly. We recognise that many of our planned events will have to be postponed. We have therefore taken the decision to postpone all events to the end of May. Revised dates cannot be given until events unfold, these are clearly outside the control of the bridge world.

Regarding the various Surrey League matches, where the heats are played in participants' homes, we will extend the deadlines, at the request of team captains. The question of whether or not heats are played is a decision for individual teams.

We are aware that various clubs have either taken the decision, or had the decision imposed on them, to temporarily cease play.

At this stage, the only recommendation we can give you is that you check relevant websites before attending a club or a match, to ensure there will be play.

Of greatest concern is that the bridge playing population has a strong overlap with the groups seen as being at particularly high risk from the virus. Perhaps you are feeling a bit off colour but not clearly unwell. That could be the time to pass on a bridge session. Maybe try internet bridge to keep the game fresh? Your club's web manager could probably help if you haven't tried on-line play before.

If in doubt, don't go out!

We hope we will be able to provide you with more concrete information in the next issue, even better to give you some good news. Until then, please be careful and take good care of yourselves.

Prize Double Dummy Puzzle #5

A hand is said to be played double dummy if everyone can choose the cards they play with full knowledge of all four hands. So, for instance, declarer need never lose a finesse to a singleton King offside, because it's clear to all the Ace will drop the King.

After East has opened a pre-emptive 3*, South plays in 6♥. For the purposes of this puzzle, West leads ♣J, and from then on it's double dummy.

There are two questions:

Q1: How does South make 6♥?

Q2: What should West have led to defeat the contract?

I'm rating this as TRICKY (but only slightly). Names of all those submitting correct-first-time solutions will be put in a Morris hat and the winner selected randomly. The prize will be free entry to a Surrey event at Oxshott of the winner's choice.

Improver Declarer Hand



Our ♠A, ♠AKQ and ♣A give us five top tricks outside trumps. Driving out ♥A will give us five trump tricks, for a total of ten. We therefore have enough tricks for our contract, although we'll need to be careful about entries.

After winning the first trick with $\triangle A$ it's important to cash $\triangle KQ$ before playing a trump. East wins with $\forall A$, cashes two club tricks and exits with a spade. We win with $\triangle A$, enter dummy in trumps and discard our losing spade on $\triangle A$. We claim the rest with our trump winners in hand.

If we make the mistake of leading a trump at trick 2 and both defenders play low, now we're unable to make more than two diamond tricks and we'll finish one down.

Charity Update

Caterham Bridge Club aims to raise a stunning £6,000 this year for their long-standing charitable donations to impoverished Secondary school students in Kenya. Secondary Education is provided free to all students in Kenya. However, once students pass the KCPE (Kenya Certificate of Primary Education) and qualify for Secondary education they have to pay for their lunches and school uniform. Some poorer children are unable to pay and without support would be excluded from school. Secondary education is for four years and the support provided costs approximately £100 a year. Caterham BC are currently supporting 42 children. The money is raised from players buying refreshments at the club's play sessions.

As mentioned in the write up from Bookham Afternoon Bridge Club, this club raised, just over, an amazing £4,000 for charitable causes.

Our Schools Cup was held once again at Roehampton Club last month, attracting 108 students from 12 schools, up from 89 and 11 last year. Roehampton is an excellent venue, and they have supported our event generously, in terms both of cost and of members' help.
