

The road to grandmaster in Bridge is a long and storied one. Unlike chess even a prodigy can't get the title at 15, it takes years no matter your level. Coming from a bridge family, Thomas started as a young teen with his twin sister Sarah both under the tutelage of John & Aileen O'Keefe. While Thomas would admit Sarah took better to the game, he had in fact been the one to catch the bridge bug. By 17 he had played his first IBU trials, represented Ireland at Youth level, and by 21 was teaching classes around Dublin, quickly gaining parts of the great reputation he boasts today. He experimented with both further education and alternative careers but his success at the Bridge table and amicability in the classroom became too strong to ignore so with a sigh and a grin he decided to become a bridge professional at 29.

With most Grandmasters their achievements ring something like, Holmes Wilson's, Caps, National Titles, of which Thomas has many.





Not many players combine administration with being a Champion and Grandmaster but Thomas has diligently being President of the CBAI just a few years ago. It shows a huge commitment to the game of Bridge as a Player, an Administrator and Professional teacher.

I remember Thomas playing in the Junior Camrose in 1999, the year the Republic of Ireland to the Camrose and Lady Milne series. It was held in Howth Lodge Hotel, now an apartment block, I was Match Assistant to Paul Porteous, John Murray the TD and 40 volunteers recorded each card played over the weekend. Toss McGee did the commentary from the Closed room down a wire across the roof and down to the Vugraph below. Thomas had a significant presence and he then was seen as a bridge star in the making.

Thomas's influence on Irish Bridge is wide spanning in both ability and age. His legacy is without doubt junior bridge, both with his participation and fundraising as a player himself in the 90's to his dedication in

bringing on the current juniors. Beginning in 2017 by fundraising to bring the most talented Youth players to the North American Bridge



Championships, in which he himself has also competed professionally with success. He says that he is a man known to every director without doubt but also to every player who can rest easy knowing a fair, high level, and pleasant game awaits them when they arrive at his table. He jokingly says

'I wish I could say the same for my partners'!
