Board No. 10 of the third Round of the Transnational Open Teams was yet another prove that on some hands game might be made in both lines.

Peter Fredin and Gary Gottlieb - North-South for Team Watkins - bid and made 4♥. To accomplish this declarer had to find the ♦A doubleton in East and limit the club suit to two losers (deep finessing twice). Declarer - Gary Gottlieb - succeeded to do so. Well played.

Four Spades can't be made as there are four losers: one in spades, two in hearts and one in diamonds. Still Pat Cummins found an imaginative way of stealing her contract when South led the ♦2 and declarer ducked the ♦K!

Pat won the next diamond and played a top spade to South's Ace. At this point South thought there was another diamond to cash and tried the ♦Q. Declarer ruffed and was able to get rid of one of her heart losers on the ♦J later. With ♣K on side there were ten tricks at the take: 15 IMP to Watkins.

How to handle a 27 HCP count when they start the bidding with a preempt at the three-level?
