We go to the most critically ill or injured patients in the region - those for whom just a few minutes could mean the difference between life and death.

We never know who our next patient will be. But **whoever** they are, **wherever** they are, we can only be there for them because of the generosity and support of people like you.

One of those patients was Jasmine, who was just four-years-old when she suffered a **life-threatening cardiac arrest** at home.

It was every parent's worst nightmare come true for Niky and Ryan, who found their daughter not breathing and immediately called for help.

Our Critical Care Team were dispatched to Gloucestershire with two Critical Care Doctors and a Specialist Paramedic arriving on scene in less than 20 minutes.



Jasmine's Mum, Niky, recalls:

"By the time your team arrived I was crumbling, at a loss of what to do or what to expect. I will never forget Scott, Andrew and Jack's reassurances to me. I knew we now also had emergency doctors onsite, trained in Paediatrics, and they had her, they had "this". I felt complete trust in them. During the worst, most horrific episode that any parent could be in, I felt safe."
