

### ACBL PRESIDENT JOANN GLASSON APPOINTS OUR OWN DINI ROMITO AS GOODWILL AMBASSADOR

"If you've ever played Bridge at the Delaware Shore then you are familiar with the Queen of Bridge Miss Dini Romito. Dini started recruiting and teaching Bridge back in 1980 "whenever and wherever anyone wanted to learn". Introducing and teaching Bridge to new players was her pride, her joy and her passion.

In 1995 Dini coupled her teaching with managing and Directing live games at ultimately three locations, Lewes, Rehoboth Beach and Ocean View Delaware. Dini has the perfect attitude and personality to Direct games. Her primary objective is to insure that all players enjoy themselves, have a good time and go home happy. She does not accept anything but good behavior from everyone in the room and handles director calls with a smile.

Dini learned the ACBL scoring software program for electronic game scoring. Soon thereafter she began teaching the program to other directors and managers in other Delaware and nearby Maryland clubs. Dini encouraged many players to become teachers and participated in their training. Some eventually started their own games.

Dini was diligent and instrumental in providing a forum for lessons for bridge players at all levels of accomplishment - Newbie, Beginner, Intermediate and Advanced. Dini recognized that the life blood of growing the bridge - playing community lay in recruiting people willing to play Duplicate Bridge, even if they're innate desire was to improve their game for "party" bridge. She also recognized the importance of a grass-roots effort to grow the game, and she specialized in doing so.

At special bridge events, such as the Holidays and parties to celebrate bridge player accomplishments, Dini invariably had a "covered dish" event. Dini would always have something she, herself, prepared for the game. If you haven't had her "lemon squares", you've missed a delectable treat

District 4 voted Dini to the ACBL's "Goodwill Committee". This is a lifetime appointment for dedication to the betterment of Bridge, particularly in the area of active ethics, conduct, tournament conditions and the promotion of Bridge.

Today we would like to honor Dini by upgrading her to "Ambassador" of the Goodwill Committee for her devotion to the game, for bringing in hundreds if not thousands of new players to the game and for her constant smile, amazing humor, laughter and genuine love of the people and the game we play.
