Player Spotlight- Michael Lavine



Michael Lavine comes from a bridge playing family. Michael's great-uncle was Sam Rabinowitz, a well-known player in Trenton, NJ who wrote the bridge column for the Trenton Times. Michael's uncle Herb Lavine is one of the top money bridge players in New York City and was featured several times in the New York Times bridge columns. Herb's cousin Marty Rabinowitz is an active tournament player and participated in the Bridge Bulletin's Bidding Box in January of 2018.

As a youth Michael learned bridge from his parents. He played some – not very well he now realizes – into his thirties when he left the game and pursued a career as a statistician. Michael taught statistics at Duke University for twenty years, then UMass Amherst for ten years. After he retired from UMass he moved back to Durham and joined the Army Research Office where he directed ARO's program for probability and statistics until his second retirement, in 2020. It was then that he again took up bridge and started playing at the Triangle Bridge Academy. Michael would like to thank Henry Meguid and Chris Moll for helping him get started there and for finding partners who matched his level in the game.

Without a job to occupy his time and thoughts, Michael started studying and playing bridge more intensively. He likes bridge for its complexity and teamwork and enjoys feeling that he is increasing his mastery of the game, even though he will tell you he still needs to count better and more consistently.
