# Member Spotlight – Joanna Karwowska – Jeff Kimmel

Born in Poland and Joanna immigrated to the United States with her husband, Hugon (also a bridge player), to attend graduate school in Bloomington, Indiana before coming to Chapel Hill. During those years in graduate school, she initially learned to play bridge. Like many of



us, Joanna found that family and work required her to put bridge aside for many years except for an occasional social game.

More recently she decided to return to the game. Lessons, particularly the Barometer Games, from Henry Meguid, finding other players who were willing to partner with her, and participating in the mentee-mentor program enabled Joanna to further develop her skills. She says that her mentor, Jane Kiernan, "put up with my

crazy bids and plays with infinite patience" and helped her move forward in applying Henry's lessons. She continues to work on declarer play, occasionally adding a convention, and trying to pay attention to signaling. Although she is still challenged by all aspects of the game, she continues to have fun.


Most recently she drew a long-time friend and work colleague, Jeff Kimmel, back into the game. They have developed a successful partnership.

Jeff grew up in Pennsylvania and Ohio, then he and his wife, Susan, moved to Raleigh after college. They took bridge lessons as newlyweds with Fred Bertram, who introduced students to his Raleigh Vanderbilt Bridge Club. After only a few lessons and precious little play, Jeff and Susan "dropped in" at the club to play their first game of duplicate –an unsuspecting club championship game! They played at the Vanderbilt until moving to Durham. Jeff was then fortunate to partner with colleague Eric Hamilton and with Huron until a relocation to California triggered a 20 year hiatus from bridge. As Joanna returned to bridge, she asked Jeff to join her. They find that the dynamics of a bridge partnership fit their relationship well, as they have always challenged each other. Jeff added "Laughing at our many failures helps." Joanna says "Play with whom you enjoy playing. And with whom you have similar goals - to improve your game, to have fun, or to win. But you have to work on it to get better." Joanna and Jeff choose to work on their game by analyzing and discussing <u>both</u> their successes and mistakes either in person or by email. She tries to put aside a bad result at the table, move on to the next hand, and do the best she can with it.

Regarding bridge and partnership development, Jeff adds "Regular play with patient, stronger partners who serve as mentors has been key. Playing against stronger opponents teaches both skills and humility. Now I find that post-mortem analysis using hand records, The Common Game results, and sometimes a bridge solver, such as <u>https://mirgo2.co.uk/bridgesolver/</u>, has helped me cement concepts and recognize patterns. Another bridge solver that others may find helpful, Deep Finesse, is for Windows only.

Both Joanna and Jeff enjoy the more personal interactions of Face-to-Face bridge: seeing familiar faces and having conversations before and after the game and sometimes between hands. She thinks people can "Enjoy the game, no matter how impossible it seems to master. It challenges your analytical skills, your memory and it humbles you. "Remember it is a game! Done right, bridge is fun and challenging at any level or format."
