Grand National Teams 2025-2026

Bridge clubs across the country have been running GNT qualifying team games. What does that mean? GNT stands for Grand National Teams, and it is an annual ACBL bridge competition conducted each year at the Summer NABC (Minneapolis, MN in 2026).

To play in the Summer NABC GNT game, a player must first qualify in their District (Unit 191 is in District 7). District 7 encompasses North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, and the eastern portion of Tennessee. To play in the District GNT game, a player must first qualify at a club-level GNT qualifying game.

There are four categories within the GNT competition. Flight C is for non-life master players having less than 750 MP. Flight B is for players with less than 3000 MP. Flight A is for players with less than 6000 MP. The Championship flight is for open players.

District 7 will be holding its District GNT game in Columbia, SC, on March 27-29, 2026. Flight C is a one-day event. Flights A, B, and Championship are two-day events. Specific details of the competition can be found at this link.

Now for the fun part. The top 2 teams in each Flight will advance to the Summer NABC in Minneapolis. District 7 will provide a stipend for each player to help cover travel and hotel expenses at the NABC- \$3,200 per team.

Here are some reasons why you should get your team together, qualify in a local team game, and compete in the District 7 GNT competition:

- It will be a fun day playing bridge. Any day we get to play bridge in a regional event is a good day.
- Columbia is not "too far."
- Playing in the District GNT game is a great experience. You play in a Flight against others with your experience level. You will meet other players from our District, many of whom will become friends who you will see at other events.
- You will have the opportunity to win Gold masterpoints.
- It is very possible that you will finish at the top and head to an NABC

Dear Bridge Players,

Unit 191's bridge mentoring program continued in October. The program sponsors games in person, at Triangle Bridge Academy, and online, on BBO. The in-person games have two tiers. Tier I is for mentees with fewer than 250 masterpoints playing with mentors who have fewer than 500 masterpoints. Tier II is for mentees with fewer than 500 masterpoints; mentors are unlimited.

Refreshments are provided by a crew of volunteers — Ray Boylan, Ann Fisher, Martha Schulwitz, and Maggie Smith — to whom we offer our appreciation. They are always looking for more volunteers. Please email one of them if you can help. Tier I plays on the 4th Tuesday of each month at 10 AM, preceded by an optional lesson from Henry Meguid at 9:15.

The October game was on Tuesday, October 28 and had seven tables, a bit more than the September game. Congratulations to **Carrie Dailey, Larry Stanczyk, Diana Spock, and Carolyn Hammond**, who finished first in their directions.

Tier II plays on the 2nd Tuesday of each month at 10 AM, preceded by an optional lesson at 9:15 given by a rotating set of advanced players. The October game was on Tuesday, October 14. The lesson was actually a quiz on second hand play after a card is led by declarer or dummy. If you would like a lesson or quiz on second hand play, try http://rpbridge.net/rpil.htm, scroll down to the Intermediate Level, and find the line for Second Hand Play. The game had six tables, one more than last month. The scores were remarkably close, with no one above 57% and no one below 43%. Congratulations to all on a very competitive and pleasant game.

The online game is new this year and is for mentees with fewer than 500 masterpoints. The mentees play together in pairs at 7 PM on the third Wednesday of each month. After the game, a panel of advanced players write comments on all the boards, which are then circulated to the mentees. Many thanks to the panel members for volunteering their time and expertise: Glen Anderson, John Cobb, Mary Jo Dunnebacke, Renee Getz, Eric Hamilton, and Michael Lavine. You may vote for up to two candidates. Ballots having votes for more than two candidates will not be counted.


You may only vote once. Multiple submissions from one person will invalidate all of their ballots.


Unit 191 Board of Directors Nominee Statements
