Ann Fisher brought up the idea of whether the board needs to continue to have 12 members, as required by our by-laws. The board voted to keep the current board membership at 12 members for 2025 and review this policy before our next election cycle.

Mentor Mentee Update: The MM Committee has expanded and has put together a format for 2 monthly games – Tier I and Tier II. Tier II games have no master point limits. Tier I games are geared to accommodate players with fewer masterpoints (mentees <250 and mentors <500). Exceptions can be made by the committee chair, Michael Lavine.
