The Goals of Preemptive Bids

- 1. Limit the hand's strength
- 2. Describe the hand's shape immediately
- 3. Disrupt opponents' auctions by taking bidding space
- 4. Direct the opening lead

Three Factors To Consider When Preempting

Suit Quality

Position

Vulnerability

Position at the Table

Preempt aggressively in 1^{st} and 3^{rd} seat Preempt conservatively in 2^{nd} seat In 4^{th} seat, do not preempt

Vulnerability

Preempt aggressively with Favorable vulnerability (white vs. red)

Preempt conservatively with Unfavorable vulnerability (red vs. white)

Level of Preempts

• Weak two bids (2 ◆ , 2 ♥ , or 2 ♠) show a 6-card suit

• Weak three bids $(3 \clubsuit, 3 \blacklozenge, 3 \blacktriangledown)$, or $3 \spadesuit$ show a 7-card suit

Weak four bids (4♣, 4♦, 4♥, or 4♠) show an 8-card suit

Opening a Weak Two Bid

- 5-9/10 hcp
- A 6-card suit in 1st and 2nd seat (may be a good five in 3rd and favorable vulnerability)
- Usually, 2/3 or 3/5 top honors
 - KQ9865; AQ9764; AJT743;QJT852
- 2 of the top 5 with good intermediates (98 or 97)
 - AJ984; KJ9765; KT9864
- Suit strength can vary with vulnerability and position
- It is okay to open a weak two with a void or an outside Ace
- Don't open a weak two with a good side four-card major

THE Guideline OF 500

This also known as the Rule of Two and Three

 When you preempt the opponents from reaching a game, make sure you only go down <u>two</u> when vulnerable and down <u>three</u> when non-vulnerable

Be more cautious when vulnerable

Guidelines For Responding to Preemptive Bids

Once you preempted, don't bid again unless forced by partner

Responder is the captain of the auction

The degree of trump fit is more critical than points

Compete immediately to the number of combined trumps held by the partnership

Further the preempt as high as you dare as fast as you dare

Responder needs 16+ HCP to force opener to bid again

Responding to a Weak Two Bid



Non-Forcing

Tactical raise to the 3-level to use bidding space, it's to play

Raise to game to further the preempt

Bid a new suit at level three to show 6+ cards and 16+ points

Forcing

Bid 2NT* (artificial) to show 16+ points and ask opener for an outside feature, an Ace or King Depends on degree of fit and shape, not hcp

Law of total tricks
Mel's Guideline of 17
Add hcp+ number of cards in weak suit,
if 17 bid game

Responder supports with 2 cards, raise to game with 3 cards and 8-9 hcp, or rebid the weak two bid suit at the 3-level without support

Opener shows a feature with 8-9 hcp, rebid suit with less points







Defense Against Weak Two Bids

Do not preempt over a preempt

A Takeout double of a major promises opening values and 4 cards in the other major


A takeout double of 2 promises at least seven cards in the majors

A double followed by bidding notrump, or a new suit shows a 19+ hands

An overcall of 2NT shows 15-18 HCP and stoppers (Stayman and Jacoby Transfers are on)

Overcall, promises a 5-6 cards and opening values

Cuebid to ask for a stopper to play in 3NT


