So why am I advocating bidding or rebidding 2NT on all these hands?

- It expresses your overall strength to partner.
- It expresses the essentially balanced nature of your hand to partner.
- Strong 4-4-4-1 hands are notoriously difficult to bid, ones with a small singleton should probably just open at the one level and pray, but if you have a stiff A or K a 2NT opener is probably best but can come a cropper!
- Don't worry about bidding 2NT with a five or four card major, You will have the ability to find your 5-3 and 4-4 major suit fits using puppet stayman which I will come on to shortly.
- When you open a strong two or benji two partner will know you are unbalanced – it gives more definition to your strong two bids.

Partner has opened 2NT (which could have a 5 card Major, 4 card Major or if you are me occasionally a 6 card minor!)

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You need to ask yourself the following questions?

- 1) Have I got a 5 card Major if so bid it at the 3 Level.
- 2) Have I got 1 or more 4 card Majors if so bid 3♦, we will come on to the follow ups shortly.
- 3) If I have neither of the above bid 3NT.

So on the hands opposite – what do I bid?

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Hand 1 - 3♠ (I have a 5 card Major).
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Hand 2 - 3♦ (I have 1 or more 4 card majors).

Hand 3 - 3NT (I have neither a 5 or 4 card major).

Hand 4 - 3♦ (I have 1 or more 4 card majors).

On Hand 1 – bid 4♦ – showing both majors and a game only hand asking partner to choose. Partner can now place the contract.

On Hand 2 – bid 3♠ showing 4♥ i.e bid the major you do <u>not</u> have – the reason for this is so the strong hand plays the contract. Partner can now place the contract.

On hand 3 – bid 3♥ - showing 4♠ i.e bid the major you do <u>not</u> have – the reason for this is so the strong hand plays the contract. Partner can now place the contract.

On hand 4 - bid 4 - showing a slam going hand with both majors, partner is now in control of the auction.

On hand 5 – also bid $4\clubsuit$ - showing a slam going hand with both majors, partner is now in control of the auction.

In summary

- a) Open or rebid 2NT on hands that are essentially balanced and don't worry if they contain a five card major.
- b) Use Puppet Stayman to locate your 5-3, 5-4 and 4-4 major suit fits and the strong hand nearly always plays the contract.
- c) Combine with red suit transfers and a 3♠ bid showing precisely 5♠ and 4♥.
