John was introduced to me by Norman Lawrenson when I joined the club in 2000. We played regularly thereafter, becoming firm friends. His health had been declining since the beginning of the year, and in April he moved into Mockley Manor care home in Ullenhall.

Originally from the Rhymney valley in South Wales, John was one of four children and he always spoke lovingly of his childhood in a mining community. The family moved to Birmingham before the second world war. John served in the RAF throughout the war and later founded a successful insurance broking business. He was married to Edna for nearly 70 years. She predeceased him.

John had a lifelong passion for golf at which he excelled and his bridge wasn't all that bad!

Derek Andrews – 20 August 2018



Derek passed away at his home on Monday 20 August 2018, following a fall.

He was best known for his unswerving support of his late wife, Yvonne, who devoted over thirty years of service to Bridge in Warwickshire; was a Life Member of the County, and a Dimmie Fleming Award Winner. Derek, with Yvonne, were dedicated supporters of local events long after Yvonne retired from Office, attending almost every event in the Warwickshire calendar.

Following Yvonne's death in 2016, it was clear to those who knew Derek well, that the loss of his wife and bridge partner was profound, and left a huge

chasm in his life. Even so, Derek continued to support the West Midlands E team in Division 3/4 of the Warwickshire league.

Derek continued to play bridge and made some new friends. He was a very thoughtful player, and was always happy to help others through the medium of giving regular lessons. He greatly missed being across the table from, and at times sparring with, Yvonne – even when he was in trouble – but now, taking his seat opposite his beloved Yvonne at the Eternal Bridge Table, their bridge will finally be in perfect harmony with each other for all eternity.

Philip Moseley – 23 December 2017

We are sad to announce the death of Philip Moseley. A long standing member of West Midlands Bridge Club, Philip passed quietly away at 5.30am on Saturday 23rd December 2017. Philip will be sadly missed by his many friends at the Club.

Peter Court – 31 October 2017

Sadly, after many years of illness, Peter Court passed away on 31st October in Heartlands Hospital.

A member of the West Midlands Bridge Club Board of Directors and Management Committee Peter was heavily involved with the 2006 Club renovation project - his efforts cemented the Club's sound financial footing that enabled the 2006 extension project to go ahead. Linked to this, Peter was co-organiser of the Club's first Loan Note Scheme, which was set up to support the costs of the project. Peter became chairman of the Management Committee in 2007 and guided the Club Management and Working Committees through a restructuring process to form the new management structure of the Club, which is still in operation today. In 2008 Peter became Company Secretary, and Finance Director, until he stood down in 2011 as a result of ill health.

Graham Sherlock-Brown – 20 March 2017

After a long and difficult fight against a condition he had battled with for many years Graham passed peacefully away at 2.45pm on Monday 20 March 2017.

Until recently, when his condition prevented him from so doing, Graham played bridge regularly at the Club, and represented the Club in competition on many occasions. He was a member of the Bridge Committee and team of Tournament Directors.

Betty Eden – 21 December 2016

Unexpectedly but peacefully Betty passed away on 21 December 2016 at Heartlands Hospital aged 84 years. She had been married to her husband, Jan, for 60 plus years and will be missed by daughter Julia, granddaughters Steffani and Philippa and her family and friends.

Betty will be best known for Tournament Directing Thursday morning and Wednesday afternoon sessions and for issuing the old style paperbased masterpoints, which took a great deal of time, and patience, to hand write. Betty also served on the Bridge Committee.

Larry Sayer – 18 October 2016

We are sad to announce the death of Larry Sayer who passed away on Wednesday 19 October 2016. Larry, a founder member of West Midlands Bridge Club, was a member of the inaugural Committee in 1966 and one of the first Directors, in 1976, of West Midlands Bridge Club Limited.

Larry served on the Committee, then Board, of the Club numerous times between 1966 and 2006, holding a number of offices including that of Chairman. In 2015, in recognition of many years of service to the Club, Larry was awarded Honorary Life Membership of West Midlands Bridge Club Limited.

It was Larry's wish that after his death his body be donated to the Cancer Research department at Keele University.

Yvonne Andrews 8 June 2016



We are sad to announce that Yvonne Andrews passed away on Wednesday 8 June 2016. Yvonne, a Life Member of Warwickshire CBA, devoted over thirty years of service to bridge administration and development in Warwickshire. Yvonne was a member of the Warwickshire Council until 1970, when she joined the Executive Committee, and then went on to hold a number of offices including, Minutes Secretary, Chairman, Shareholder, Midland Counties Congress Committee Member/Chairman and, until her retirement from bridge administration in 2000, General Secretary. Yvonne was awarded the English Bridge Union's Dimmie Fleming Award for services to bridge at County level, and Life Membership of Warwickshire CBA and the Midland Counties Congress, in recognition of her dedication and commitment. Although Yvonne had not enjoyed good health recently, she still managed to play some bridge, and maintain a keen interest in the affairs of the County. Yvonne will be sorely missed by all who knew her.

Michael Fisher (President) – 18 May 2015

Due to failing health Michael had not attended the Club for some time, but prior to his illness he was a great presence at the Club, and played bridge regularly. Michael joined the Club in 1972 and became a Board Member in 1978. Elected Chairman of the Board in 1983, Michael led the Club through its first major development scheme, and was proud to see his hard work rewarded when the then new extension was opened.

In July 1994 Michael organised a full week of events to celebrate 100 years of Bridge, including a match against an International Team, which was Vu-

Graphed to the World. In 1998 Michael played a major role in steering the Club through its second major development scheme.

In 2003, in recognition of his service to the Club, Michael was made Life President and an Honorary Life Member of the Club.

Although we have not had the pleasure of seeing Michael for some time he has been in our thoughts and Carolyn has kept us informed. We are confident that Michael will always have West Midlands Bridge Club in his thoughts as he now watches over us from the eternal bridge table in the sky.

Michael's charm and charisma will be sorely missed by all who knew him.

Norman Lawrenson – 25 March 2015

Norman was a Founder Member of the Club and had served on the Board and various Committees over many years. In 2011, in recognition of his work, Norman was made a Life Member.

Hylda Townsend – 13 November 2014



Hylda was a doyenne of bridge who, until recent times, was a keen and active bridge player, as well as being a committed and capable bridge administrator.

At National level, Hylda became a Vice President of the English Bridge Union in 1997; was the recipient of a Dimmie Fleming award in 1993, and had been a long serving Member of the English Bridge Union Tournament Committee.

At County level, Hylda served as Chairman and a Shareholder of Warwickshire Contract Bridge Association, being made a Life Member for her services to the County in 2009. Hylda always kept a keen eye on the affairs of the County, and over many years Chairmen have found her insight and support extremely valuable.

At Club level, Hylda was a Founder Member, Life Member, and President (1979-1981), of Moseley Bridge Club. She was also a Life Member of North Birmingham Bridge Club where she was instrumental in helping the Club to acquire its premises. A Life Member of West Midlands Bridge Club, Hylda was heavily involved in many aspects of the Club's management and, well into her nineties, ran an assisted play session, from which a number of enthusiastic bridge players emerged.

Hylda, unfortunately, stopped playing bridge a few years ago, but will now be taking her seat at the Eternal Bridge Table where all her finesses, endplays and squeezes will be fruitful, and where during the bidding she will always be on the same wavelength as her partner.

Hylda's personality, sense of humour, and all-round presence, will remain forever in the hearts of all those who knew her.

Over that period Jack provided the club with furnishings, staircase banisters and made the serving hatches from specially imported timbers.

Jack played regularly, latterly on Wednesday afternoons until last year. He will be missed by his many friends.
