Let it suffice to say in these notes that we, in North Wales, were delighted firstly, that the first ever Home Match to be played in the North of the Principality resulted in a convincing win and secondly, that the North Wales Pair, Stanley Moses and Percy Davies had such a good match. Percy, as most of my readers know, had only just come out of a Nursing Home where he had undergone a painful though not very serious operation. I am sorry to say that he has had to go back into the Nursing Home for further treatment, not, I am sure as a result of his efforts in the Scot's match but just one of those things. Anyhow it has meant that, much to his regret he is unable to make the trip to the W.B.U. Congress, at Porthcawl, and as his partner is unable to obtain leave of absence, I am afraid that the North Wales team for the North v South match cannot be considered to be the strongest we can put out.
